Footpath No. 10 Diversion Order, 1964*

Its effect will be to divert the public right of way running southwards from a point 70 yards west of the Methodist Chapel, Slapton, to a new footpath 4 feet in width commencing at the same point and running southwards for 330 yards along the western boundary of fields O.S.
