The Trunk Road (High Street and Bury Road, Newmarket) (Restriction of Waiting) Order, 1964

The Minister of Transport has made an Order under section 26 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960 the effect of which is that no person shall cause or permit any vehicle to wait:

(a) in any of the lengths or on any of the sides of the London-Norwich Trunk Road (A.11) specified in Schedule 1 hereto; or
(b) on the side of the said Trunk Road specified in Schedule 2 hereto:

(i) for a longer period than 20 minutes; or (ii) if a period of less than 40 minutes has elapsed since the termination of the last period of waiting (if any) of the vehicle on that side.

Exceptions have been provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle, or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition the removal of any obstruction to or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein.

Lengths and sides of the London-Norwich Trunk Road (A.11) in the Urban District of Newmarket

1. High Street, south-east side, from a point 25 yards south-west of its junction with Dullingham Road (B.1061) to a point 125 yards north-east of that junction.

2. High Street from a point 125 yards north-east of its junction with Dullingham Road (B.1061) to a point 67 yards north-east of its junction with The Avenue (B.1103).

3. High Street from a point 23 yards north-east of its junction with Rous Road to its junction with Upper Station Road.

4. The road surrounding the island site at the junction of High Street, Exeter Road, Fordham Road, Bury Road and Upper Station Road.

5. Bury Road, north-west side from its junction with the road on the north-east side of the island site at the junction of High Street, Exeter Road, Fordham Road, Bury Road and Upper Station Road for a distance of 40 yards in a north-easterly direction.
