**NOTICE OF SEIZURE UNDER THE CUSTOMS  
AND EXCISE ACT, 1952.**

Pursuant to section 275 (5) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952, and paragraph 1 of the 7th Schedule thereto, the Commissioners of Customs and Excise hereby give you notice that by virtue of the powers contained in the Customs and Excise Acts and enactments amending those Acts, certain goods, to wit American Ford, Chassis number 177608, registered number M 150-580 found on 8th January 1964, at Old Swan Police Station, Liverpool, has been seized as liable to forfeiture upon the grounds that the said goods were imported goods chargeable with a duty of customs and were allowed to be delivered without payment of that duty on condition that they were for the private use of Roland H. Ingraham and that he would not dispose of them within two years from the 3rd February 1963, and the said condition has not been observed.

Whereby and by force of section 257 (1) of the Customs and Excise Act, 1952, the said goods are liable to forfeiture.
