Royal County of Berkshire

(Gipsy Lane, Wokingham) (No Waiting) Order, 1964

Notice is hereby given that the Berkshire County Council propose to make an Order under section 26 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 8 p.m. on any day in Gipsy Lane, Wokingham, from its junction with Langborough Road in a general south-easterly direction to the eastern boundary of 45 Gipsy Lane, a distance of approximately 160 yards.

Exceptions are included in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle, to enable goods to be loaded onto or unloaded from the vehicle or to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any funeral, building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, or the maintenance of the road or the services therein, or to enable a vehicle to take in petrol, oil, water or air from any garage adjacent to the road.

MAIDENHEAD BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Maidenhead Borough Council (Bell Street) Traffic Regulation Order, 1964

SECOND SCHEDULE

1. Bell Street (north side) from a point 69 yards east of its junction with King Street to the eastern boundary of 25, Bell Street.

2. Bell Street (south side) from a point 19 yards east of its junction with King Street to the eastern boundary of 48, Bell Street.

THIRD SCHEDULE

Bell Street (south side) from the western boundary of 50, Bell Street to the eastern boundary of 58, Bell Street.

BALDOCK URBAN DISTRICT

Road Traffic Act, 1962, section 28

The Hertfordshire County Council (Baldock) Experimental Traffic Diversion Order, 1964

Notice is hereby given that the Hertfordshire County Council have made an Order under section 28 of the Road Traffic Act, 1962, the effect of which is as follows:

1. During the periods:

(a) commencing at 7 a.m. on any Sunday and ending at 12 midnight on that day;

(b) commencing at midnight on any Bank Holiday and ending at 11 p.m. on that day; and

(c) commencing at 11 p.m. on any Good Friday and ending at 7 a.m. on the following Easter Sunday,

no person shall drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle on any of the lengths of road specified in the following Schedule otherwise than in the direction specified opposite to those lengths in the said Schedule.

2. During the periods specified in Article 1 above every person causing any vehicle to proceed in that length of the A.505 County road known as the Royston Road, Baldock, shall cause that vehicle, on reaching the junction of Royston Road with Clothall Road, to turn left into Clothall Road.

Lengths of roads in the Urban District of Baldock and Direction

Clothall Road between its junction with White Horse Street and its junction with South Road. From North West to South East.

South Road between its junction with Clothall Road and its junction with High Street. From North East to South West.

WILTSHIRE COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Wilts (Petticoat Lane, Dilton Marsh) Width Restriction Order, 1964

Notice is hereby given that the Wiltshire County Council have applied to the Minister of Transport for confirmation of an Order made by them under section 26 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be to prohibit with certain exceptions any person to drive or cause or permit to be driven any vehicle the width of which, including any load on the vehicle, exceeds six feet on Petticoat Lane, Dilton Marsh.
