

EAST SUSSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of East Sussex (East Street and Albion Street, Lewes) (Prohibition of Waiting and Limited Waiting) Order, 1964.

Notice is hereby given that a Public Inquiry will be held by Lt.-Col. F. Gordon Tucker at Pelham House, St. Andrew's Lane, Lewes, on Monday, 20th April 1964, at 10.30 a.m. to consider the proposal of the East Sussex County Council to make an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be to prohibit vehicles waiting (with certain exceptions which include the loading and unloading of goods vehicles) between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive:

- (a) in any of the lengths of roads referred to in the First Schedule to this notice;
- (b) in the length of road referred to in the Second Schedule to this notice, for a longer period than 30 minutes in any one hour;
- (c) in the length of road referred to in the Third Schedule to this notice, for a longer period than one hour in any four hours.

Any person interested is entitled to be heard in person or by Counsel, Solicitor or Agent, and any person whether he intends to appear at the inquiry or not may forward any objection to the proposal to Lt.-Col. F. Gordon Tucker, C.B.E., T.D., at the undermentioned address.

A copy of a statement of reasons for making the Order may be obtained on application to me.

Notice is also given of the intention of the County Council to substitute "158 feet" for "45 feet" in paragraph (d) of the First Schedule and also in the Third Schedule to this notice.

Objections to this last mentioned intention should be sent in writing to me by 11th April 1964, and will also be considered at the above-mentioned Public Inquiry.

FIRST SCHEDULE

Lengths of roads in the Borough of Lewes

- (a) The east side of Albion Street from its junction with High Street to its junction with East Street.
- (b) The west side of Albion Street from its junction with High Street northwards for a distance of 45 feet and from its junction with East Street southwards for a distance of 120 feet.
- (c) The south side of East Street from its junction with North Street to its junction with Eastgate Street.
- (d) The north side of East Street from its junction with Eastgate Street westwards for a distance of 45 feet and from its junction with North Street eastwards for a distance of 75 feet.

SECOND SCHEDULE

The west side of Albion Street from a point 45 feet north of its junction with High Street, northwards to a point 120 feet south of its junction with East Street.

THIRD SCHEDULE

The north side of East Street from a point 45 feet west of its junction with Eastgate Street westwards to a point 75 feet east of its junction with North Street.
