CHINGFORD BOROUGH COUNCIL

The Chingford Smoke Control Order, 1964 (No. 4) Notice is hereby given that the Chingford Borough Council, acting by the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Borough in exercise of the powers con-ferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air gesses of the borough in exercise of the powers conferred on them by section 11 of the Clean Air Act, 1956, on the 3rd day of March 1964, made an Order entitled the Chingford Smoke Control Order, 1964 (No. 4) declaring the area described in the Schedule hereto to be a smoke control area, which Order is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Subject to the exemptions provided by the Order and by virtue of section 11 (4) of the Act if, on any day after the Order has come into operation, smoke is emitted from a chimney of any building within the smoke control area the occupier of that within the smoke control area the occupier of that building shall be guilty of an offence and liable to a fine not exceeding £10 unless he proves that the emission of smoke was not caused by the use of any fuel other than an authorised fuel. The authorised fuels include anthracite, coke and other carbonised fuels are and electricity. fuels, gas and electricity.

If confirmed the Order will not come into operation

before the 1st December 1964, or before a later date determined by the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

Copies of the Order and of the map referred to therein may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Chingford, London E.4, at all reasonable times during the period of six weeks from the 27th March

Within the said period any person who will be affected by the Order may by notice in writing to the Secretary, Ministry of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, object to the confirmation of the Order.

All that portion of the Borough of Chingford, having an area of approximately 93 acres, bounded on the north of Ainslie Wood Road and Inks Green (south side only); Ropers Avenue and East View (both sides); on the east by part of Larkshall Road (west side only); on the south by the Chingford/ Walthamstow Borough boundary and on the west by Chingford Mount Road (east side only) and comprising 726 domestic buildings; 3 factories, 39 shops and offices, 2 social and educational premises and 1 other premises, as more particularly delineated and coloured green on the deposited map.
