Lisbon, May 4. N. S. The Portuguese are in a readiness to act with Vigour; and their Forces, when assembled at Ciudad-Rodrigo, will consist of about \$500 Foot and 2000 Horse compleat. The Troops of the Province of Almeida are in a very good Condition; and those that are to join enform Alentejo are on their March thither. The Cavalry of Lisbon, consisting of 340 Horse, are gone towards the Frontiers; and the Duke of Cadaval, who expects every Day the Arrival of the Regiments from Ireland, has fix'd his Departure to the 10th Instant.

Terin, May 4. The Hereditary Prince of Hesse-Cassell arrived here from Genoa on the sirst Instant; and it is believed he will stay with us till the opening of the Campagne. All our Advices from France say, That the Enemy have countermanded 12 Battalions of their Troops, which were on their March for Spain, to reinforce their Army in Dauphine. His Royal Highness being somewhat weak after his late Indisposition, designs to go to morrow to one of his Country Scats, with the Durchess Confort, and the two young Princes, for the Benefit of the Air, and Recovery of his Strength.
