

CORNWALL COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Cornwall (St. Ives) (Various Streets) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1964

Notice is hereby given that on the 27th April 1964, the Cornwall County Council made an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. daily during the period from the 1st June to the 30th September (both dates inclusive) in each year in the lengths of road specified in the Schedule hereto.

Exceptions are provided in the Order to allow a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary to allow a person to board or alight; to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded; to enable vehicles to be used in connection with building operations, the maintenance or improvement of the said lengths of road or of the services therein; to take in petrol, oil, water or air from a garage and in connection with a funeral.

SCHEDULE

Lengths of Road in the Borough of St. Ives

(i) Trelyon Avenue (A.3074)—between a point 88 yards south-east of its junction with the approach road leading to the Edward Hain Memorial Hospital and its junction with the private road leading to the Tregenna Castle Hotel, a distance of 560 yards or thereabouts.

(ii) Fish Street (Unclassified Borough Road)—from its junction with The Wharf (Unclassified Borough Road) to its junction with St. Peter's Street (Unclassified Borough Road), a distance of 40 yards or thereabouts;

(iii) The Unclassified Borough Road extending from its junction with Ventnor Terrace and Clodgy View in a northerly direction to the north-west corner of St. Ives Cemetery and thence in an easterly direction to Digey Square, a total distance of 553 yards or thereabouts.

The County of Cornwall (Looe) (Prohibition of Waiting) (Amendment) Order, 1964

Notice is hereby given that on the 27th April 1964, the Cornwall County Council made an Order under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which is to amend the existing Orders by which the waiting of vehicles is prohibited, subject to certain exceptions, from 10 a.m. to 7 p.m. daily during the period from the 1st June to the 30th September (both dates inclusive) in each year in Fore Street, Higher Market Street and Buller Street, East Looe, so that in future such restrictions shall apply from 10 a.m. to 10 p.m. daily during the said period.

CORNWALL COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Cornwall (Perranporth) (St. Piran's Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1964

Notice is hereby given that the Cornwall County Council propose to make an Order under sections 26 and 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be:

1. To amend the County of Cornwall (Perranporth) (Traffic Regulation) Order 1956, as amended by the County of Cornwall (Perranporth) (Traffic Regulation) (Amendment) Order 1963, so that the length of St. Piran's Road, Perranporth (B.3285) upon which, with certain exceptions, the waiting of vehicles is prohibited between the hours of 9 a.m. and 9 p.m. daily during the period from the 1st June to the 30th September (both dates inclusive) in each year, except on alternate sides on alternate days for a period of not exceeding twenty minutes at any one time or more than once in any consecutive period of one hour, shall be reduced by a distance of 40 yards in a south-westerly direction from its junction with Station Road.

2. To prohibit the waiting of vehicles, subject to the exceptions set out below, from 9 a.m. to 9 p.m. daily during the period 1st June to the 30th September (both dates inclusive) in each year in that length of St. Piran's Road, Perranporth (B.3285) from a point 40 yards south-west of its junction with Station Road, for a distance of 240 yards in a general north-easterly direction.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to allow a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary to allow a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded or unloaded; to enable vehicles to be used in connection with building operations, the maintenance or improvement of the lengths of road or of the services therein; to take in petrol, oil, water or air from a garage and in connection with a funeral.

Objections to the proposed Order must be sent in writing to the undersigned by the 1st June 1964.

A copy of the proposed Order, together with a plan showing the lengths of road referred to in the Order, will be available for public inspection during normal office hours at the County Hall, Truro.

(d) The whole of Cranes Road.

(e) The Elm Bottom Close—Bramley Road (C.144 and C.58) from a point 38 yards south-west of its junction with Manor Road to a point 10 yards south of Sherborne St. John Cricket Ground Entrance.

(f) Vidlers Farm Road from its junction with Elm Road south-eastwards for approximately 200 yards.

(g) Road from its junction with Vidlers Farm Road (approximately 120 yards south-east of Elm Road) north-west to join Elm Road near Sherborne St. John School.
