

SOUTHWOLD BOROUGH COUNCIL

Highways Act, 1959, Section 108 and 12th Schedule

Notice is hereby given that the Southwold Borough Council intend to apply to the Magistrates' Court sitting at the Town Hall, Southwold, on Monday, the 15th day of June 1964, at 10.30 a.m., for an Order under section 108 of the Highways Act, 1959, authorising the part of the highway known as North Road, Southwold, for a distance of 104 feet (between its junction with North Parade Gardens and North Parade) and the part of the highway known as North Parade, Southwold (connected with the eastern end of the before-mentioned section of North Road) for a distance of 211 feet from a point opposite the north end of the Pier Pavilion to its junction with the eastern end of North Road aforesaid to be stopped up (subject to the reservation of a footpath in each case) on the ground that the said lengths of highways are unnecessary.

The effect of the proposed Order is shown on the plan deposited at the Town Hall, Southwold, where it may be inspected free of charge at all reasonable times, on which the before-mentioned section of North Road is represented by the part coloured red between the lines marked D—D and C—C, and the before-mentioned section of North Parade is represented by the part coloured green between the lines marked A—A and B—B.

*Confirmation of Public Path Diversion Order**The Borough of Falmouth (Swanpool Beach) Public Path Diversion Order, 1964*

Notice is hereby given that on the 4th day of May 1964, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

Its effect will be to divert approximately 82 yards of the public right of way commencing at the most westerly end of the granite causeway on the northern side of Swanpool Beach and terminating at its junction with the public highway known as Swanpool Road to a line commencing at the most westerly end of the granite causeway above-mentioned and

terminating at the said public highway at a point 90 yards south of the above-mentioned junction.

GLASTONBURY BOROUGH COUNCIL

Notice is hereby given that the Glastonbury Borough Council intends to apply to the Justices of the Peace at the Courthouse, Glastonbury in the county of Somerset on Monday the 8th day of June 1964 at 10.30 in the forenoon for an Order under section 108 of the Highways Act 1959 relating to two footpaths running from Wells Road to Folly Lane and Snake Lane respectively as shown on the Ordnance Survey Map for Somerset Sheet L 117 (1930 Edition).

3. The Glastonbury Borough Council will therefore apply to the said Justices at the same time and place for an Order that the footpaths shown on the said plan and coloured blue be diverted to the route shown in red on the said plan.

Cheltenham Borough Council (Footpath off Nettleton Road) Extinguishment Order, 1964
