

At the Court at Buckingham Palace, the 12th day of May 1964.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in All Saints' Churchyard, Acton, in the county of Suffolk, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 26th day of February 1964, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section one of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 & 17 Vict. c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in All Saints' Churchyard, Acton, in the said county, shown hatched on the plan annexed hereto.

Provided that—

(a) In any vault or walled grave now existing in the said portion of the Churchyard, burial may

be allowed subject to the condition that every coffin buried in such vault or grave be separately enclosed by stonework properly cemented.

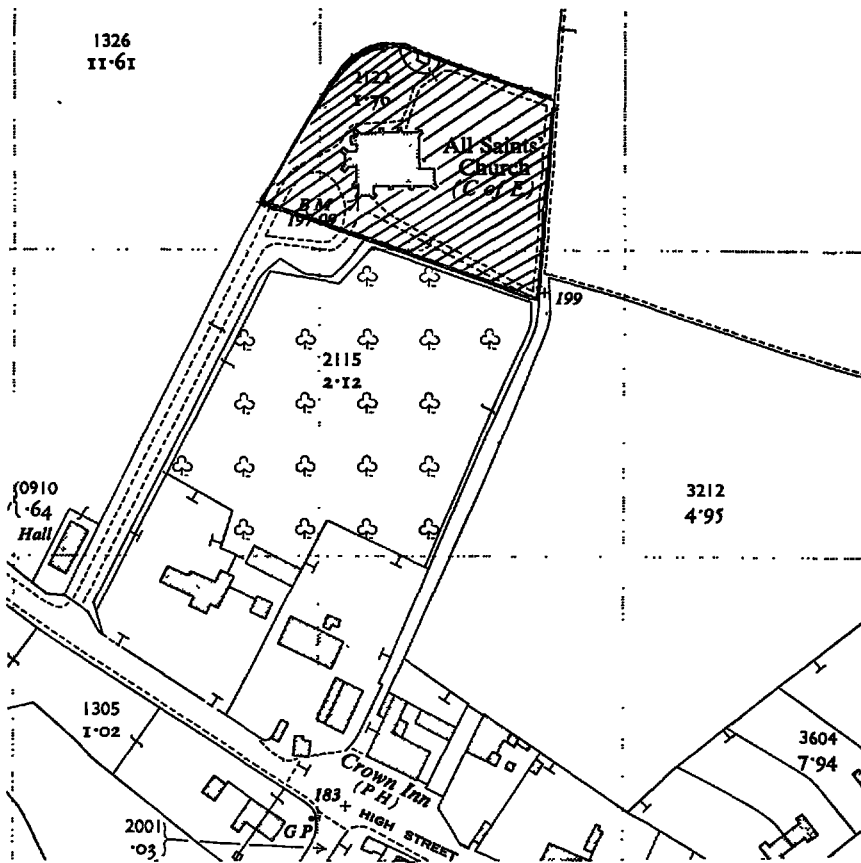
(b) In any earthen grave now existing in the said portion of the Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

(c) In the said portion of the Churchyard, in any grave space in which no interment has heretofore taken place, the burial may be allowed of the body of any person for whom or of any member of a family for which such grave space has been reserved and appropriated as a burial place, with the exclusive right of burial therein, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (All Saints' Churchyard, Acton, Suffolk) Order, 1964.
