Highways Act, 1959

The Wetherby Rural (Kearby) Public Path Diversion Order, 1963

Notice is hereby given that on the 21st day of May 1964, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above Order.

Its effect is to divert a portion of the public right of way leading from Bridge House in the Parish of Harewood to the junction of Moor Lane and Wharfe Lane in the Parish of Kearby-with-Netherby from a line crossing Baffle Beck by means of a ford, to a line crossing Baffle Beck by means of a bridge, three yards downstream from the said ford.
