BUILDING (SCOTLAND) ACT 1959

*Draft Building Standards (Scotland) Amendment
Regulations*

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State proposes to make regulations under section 3 of the above Act prescribing standards in relation to matters specified in the Fourth Schedule to that Act, to amend certain of the Building Standards (Scotland) Regulations 1963 (hereinafter referred to as the "principal regulations").

The regulations proposed to be made are similar to Regulations 3 and 5 of the Draft Building Standards (Scotland) Amendment (No. 2) Regulations 1964 published by the Secretary of State on 13th March 1964.

The proposed regulations deal respectively with amendments to Regulation 6 of the principal regulations—occupant capacity of buildings—and Regulation 41 thereof—fuel oil storage tanks.
