The QUEEN's Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in the Churchyard of the Parish Church of St. Mary the Virgin, Ringmer, in the County of Sussex, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 12th day of May 1964, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section one of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 & 17 Vict. c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the said Churchyard of St. Mary the Virgin, Ringmer, in the said County.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Churchyard of St. Mary the Virgin, Ringmer, Sussex) Order, 1964.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be preceded in Her Maisery's College
