ROYAL WARRANT OF PRECEDENCE

5th August 1964.

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased to ordain and declare that Jeryl Marcia Sarah wife of Charles Tollemache Smyth-Ryland, Gentleman, shall henceforth have, hold and enjoy the same title, rank, place, pre-eminence and precedence as the daughter of a Baron which would have been due to her had her father Robert Brampton Gurdon Esquire (commonly called The Honourable Robert Brampton Gurdon) survived his father Bertram Francis, Baron Cranworth and thereby succeeded to the title and dignity of Baron Cranworth.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in Her Majesty's College of Arms.

INTERNATIONAL ORGANISATIONS (IMMUNITIES AND PRIVILEGES) ACT, 1950

In pursuance of subsection (1) (c) of Section 2 of the International Organisations (Immunities and Privileges) Act, 1950 (14 Geo. 6, Chapter 14), Her Majesty's Principal Secretary of State for Foreign Affairs hereby gives notice of the following amendment to the amended list published in the *London Gazette* on the 24th January 1964, of persons who are entitled to immunities and privileges conferred by the Diplomatic Privileges (International Labour Organisation) Order in Council, 1949, as amended by the Diplomatic Privileges (International Labour Organisation) (Amendment) Order in Council, 1949, (hereinafter together referred to as the Order in Council). This list shall take effect in relation to the person from the date specified after his name, being the date as from which, for the purposes of the said Order in Council, such person first held the office or employment in question.

HOMICIDE ACT 1957

An Inquisition indented, taken for our Sovereign Lady the Queen, at H.M. Prison, Liverpool, pursuant to the directions of "The Capital Punishment Amendment Act, 1868," on the thirteenth day of August, in the year of our Lord one thousand nine hundred and sixty-four, before Christopher Joseph Cunliffe, Deputy Coroner of our said Lady the Queen for the said City of Liverpool on view of the body of Peter Anthony Allen now here lying dead at Her Majesty's Prison, Liverpool, within the Jurisdiction of the said Coroner, upon the oaths of the undersigned Jurors, good and lawful men of the said City of Liverpool, who being now here duly chosen, sworn, and charged to enquire, for our said Lady the Queen, when, where, and in what manner, the said Peter Anthony Allen came to his death, say upon their oaths that the said Peter Anthony Allen was a Prisoner in the said Prison, indicted and convicted for the murder of John Alan West and sentenced to death for the said offence, after the passing of the said Statute. And that judgment of death was duly executed and carried into effect upon the said offender, for the said offence, on the day and year aforesaid, within the walls of the said Prison in which the said offender was confined at the time of execution. And the Jurors aforesaid, upon their oaths aforesaid, do further say that this Inquest is now here held, on view of the body of the said offender, by the Coroner of the Jurisdiction to which the said Prison belongs, within twenty-four hours after the execution; and that the body of the said Peter Anthony Allen now here lying dead, is the identical body of the said offender, who was so convicted and executed for the offence aforesaid. And that the said offender, at the time of his death was a male person, of the age of twenty-one years, and a Dairyman.
