The QUERN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council Whereas a Representation duly made to Her Majesty in Council by the Minister of Housing and Local Government that, for the protection of the Public Health, burials should be discontinued as hereinafter directed in the Churchyard of Holy Trinity, Binegar, in the county of Somerset, has, in pursuance of an Order in Council made the 12th day of May 1964, and duly published, been taken into consideration by a Committee of the Privy Council:

Now, therefore, Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred on Her by section one of the Burial Act, 1853 (16 and 17 Vict. c. 134), and of all other powers Her enabling, is pleased, by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

1. Burials shall be discontinued forthwith and entirely in the Churchyard of Holy Trinity, Binegar. Provided that—

In any earthen grave now existing in the said Churchyard, the burial may be allowed of the body of any member of the family of the person or persons heretofore buried in such grave, subject to the condition that no part of the coffin containing the body shall be at a depth less than three feet below the level of the surface of the ground adjoining the grave.

2. This Order may be cited as the Burial Grounds (Churchyard of Holy Trinity, Binegar, Somerset) Order 1964.
