Notice is hereby given that proposals for alterations or additions to the above Development Plan were on the 23rd day of September 1964 submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

The proposals relate to land in the Metropolitan Boroughs of Stoke Newington, Hackney and Poplar. Persons making an objection or representation may register their names and addresses with the London County Council (reference LP/0.1) and will then be entitled to receive notice of any amendment of the Development Plan made as a result of the proposals.

NATIONAL COAL BOARD

OPENCAST COAL ACT, 1958
