### CENTRAL CHANCERY OF THE ORDERS OF KNIGHTHOOD

St. James's Palace, London S.W.1. 16th October 1964.

The QUEEN has been graciously pleased, on the advice of Her Majesty's Canadian Ministers, to give orders for the following promotion in the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire:

To be an Ordinary Commander of the Military Division of the said Most Excellent Order, for Gallantry:

ZD 4622 Brigadier Jacques Alfred Dextraze, D.S.O., O.B.E., C.D., General List.

During the Missionary rescue operations carried out by the ONUC Helicopter Force in Kwilu Province in the Republic of the Congo on 22nd and 23rd February 1964, Brigadier Dextraze played an important part both in direction and in actual participation. As the original planner of the operation, he initiated rescue drills which proved completely succesful. He imbued all members of the force with his own brand of fiery enthusiasm and was generally responsible for the overall efficiency and success of the rescue operations. On several occasions, Brigadier Dextraze either flew the control aircraft personally or accompanied the rescue helicopters in order to gain first hand knowledge of the situation. During the rescue operation at Kishua Nseke on 29th January 1964, he controlled the ground operations from the Otter Aircraft and carried out such close low level reconnaissance and protection missions that the rescue helicopters were able to effect the rescue quickly and with minimum danger. On this occasion despite the hazards imposed by the presence of armed Jeunesse, he displayed superb leadership and control. During the Gungu and Totshi rescues on 30th January 1964 he commanded the operation personally from the lead helicopter and was directly responsible for the saving of four Missionaries. On Sunday, 23rd February 1964, Brigadier Dextraze while visiting the troops in the rescue area received information that the Mission at Kafumba was in immediate danger. He carried out a close air reconnaissance of the area and saw the Mission being attacked by a heavily armed Jeunesse group and that the Missionaries had placed several SOS signs on the ground. Realizing that the ANC troops were somewhere in the vicinity, he set out to locate them. He dropped messages to the ANC troops requesting them to follow his line of flight to Kafumba Missionaries, telling them to head through the jungle towards the oncoming ANC Force. Having satisfied himself that the remaining Missionaries were safely in ANC hands, he returned to Kikwit air

immediately ordered the helicopters to the rescue area. As a result of Brigadier Dextraze's quick thinking and his superb handling of the situation, the ANC arrived at the Mission in time to drive off the Jeunesse and thus save over thirty Missionaries and Students who would otherwise have been killed by the Jeunesse. Throughout the same day Brigadier Dextraze remained in control of the successive helicopter rescue missions which rescued in all five wounded Missionaries, seventeen Teachers and retrieved the bodies of two Belgian UNESCO Teachers who had been killed. Whatever success was achieved by the ONUC rescue forces in the Kwilu operations must be attributed to the outstanding qualities in planning, leadership and command of Brigadier Dextraze.

ZD 2864 Lieutenant-Colonel Paul Augustus MAYER, M.B.E., C.D., The Regiment of Canadian Guards.

On 24th January 1964 Lieutenant-Colonel Mayer was charged with the rescue operations of American and European Missionaries in Kwilu Province. On 27th January 1964 during a rescue operation at Kisandji this officer rescued two nuns and three priests. Eight nuns and one priest remained. He was requested by one of the priests to speak to the native chief in an endeavour to free the remainder of the Missionaries. During talks with the native chief council, Lieutenant-Colonel Mayer was hit on the back of the neck with a club and knocked unconscious. Members of the Jeunesse removed his revolver, beret and web belt. The council argued for killing him there and then. They informed him that if one shot was fired he and all the nuns would be killed. At this point, a frenzied Jeunesse thrust the pistol in his stomach and pulled the trigger. Fortunately there was no round in the chamber. In the meantime three priests and two nuns were able to board the helicopter. After arrangements had been made to free the remaining eight nuns, Lieutenant-Colonel Mayer was allowed to leave amongst a wild and screaming mob. During the whole operation, this officer's life was in constant danger. His behaviour at all times was exemplary. His courage and composure was an inspiration to both the UN Personnel serving under him and also for the

Missionaries. On several occasions he refused to leave his post until all Missionaries had been evacuated. He behaved at all times well above the call of duty and by his patience and energy in dealing with the members of the Jeunesse saved many lives.

During ONUC rescue operations carried out by helicopter in Kwilu Province, Congo, between 24th January and 3rd February 1964, Sergeant Lessard was second in command of the ground pick up group. One sick nun was on a stretcher while the other lay on the ground in a state of exhaustion. Despite a shower of arrows aimed at the helicopter, Sergeant Lessard jumped to the ground and single handed succeeded in placing the stretcher aboard despite the fact that at the same time he was fighting off 4 Jeunesse who had tackled him from behind and tried to drag him down to the ground. Once the stretcher was aboard he reached out for the second nun who lay nearby, pushed her to safety and held off his assailants until the helicopter actually started to leave the ground. Only then did he free himself completely and jump aboard. His devotion to duty under these most hazardous conditions was a shining example these most hazardous conditions was a shining example and an inspiration to all members of the force.
