PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS, 1937 AND 1948

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice in pursuance of the above-named Regulations that he hereby recognises the Official Certificates of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto as showing (a) that the meat to which the Certificate relates or the meat from which the meat product to which the Certificate relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante and post mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Minister and (b) that all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health were taken in the dressing or preparing and packing of the meat or meat product.

As the Certificate is in the form of a stamp recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed on the meat or on the container, as the case may be.

The Certificates hereby recognised replace the Certificates reproduced in Part III of the Schedule to the notice published in the *London Gazette* of 6th August 1937, and in Part II of the Schedule to the notice published in the *London Gazette* of 27th May 1938, as modified by the notice published in the *London Gazette* of 8th September 1964, which notices are hereby revoked.
