Byelaws

Notice is hereby given that the Gwynedd River Board intend to apply at the expiration of one calendar month from the date of publication of this notice for confirmation by the Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food of a new byelaw amending the byelaws made on 6th December 1951, and confirmed by the Ministry of Agriculture and Fisheries on the 19th December 1952.

The proposed new byelaw relates to the regulation of fishing above and below certain obstructions in the Rivers Conway, Lledr and Llygwy.

During the period of one calendar month from the date of publication of this notice a copy of the said byelaw will be deposited at the office of the Board at the address given below and will be open to public inspection without charge on any weekday during the usual office hours.
