USE OF ARMS—ROYAL LICENCE

Her Majesty QUEEN ELIZABETH II was graciously pleased on the 19th day of December 1964, to give and grant unto the Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the London Borough of Newham Her Royal Licence and Authority that they may henceforth bear and use the Arms granted to The Mayor, Aldermen and Burgesses of the Incorporated Borough of West Ham granted by Letters Patent under the hands and Seals of Garter, Clarenceux and Norroy Kings of Arms bearing date the Fourteenth day of January 1887, the said Arms being first exemplified according to the Laws of Arms and recorded in the College of Arms otherwise the said Royal Licence and Permission to be void and of none effect.

And to command that the said Royal Concession and Declaration be recorded in the said College of Arms.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under section 7 of the Finance (No. 2) Act 1964, viz.:

Export Rebates Order 1965.

This Order prescribes the rate of export rebate payable on different classes of goods, described in terms of the Export List which exporters already use to classify goods on official documents.

The Order also provides that goods shall be treated for purposes of export rebate as produced or manufactured in the United Kingdom if not less than 20 per cent. of the costs of their production or manufacture is attributable to United Kingdom expenditure.

The Order comes into operation on the 19th January 1965 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1965 No. 34.

MARKING OF IMPORTED ELECTRIC INCANDESCENT LAMPS

The Board of Trade announce that in pursuance of the powers conferred on them by section 3 of the Merchandise Marks Act 1926 they have given a Direction, namely, the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 2 Order 1928 (Provisional Exemptions) Direction 1965 in regard to the Merchandise Marks (Imported Goods) No. 2 Order 1928, as amended.

The Direction exempts imported electric incandescent lamps of the following description from having to bear an indication of origin as prescribed by the Order and permits the indication to be (i) indelibly stamped, embossed, incised or impressed on the cap of the lamp and (ii) indelibly marked on the carton, wrapper or other container in which the lamp is
