*Amendment of Durham County Development Plan Durham City Comprehensive Development Area—Designation Map (Claypath)*

Notice is hereby given that a proposal for an alteration or addition to the above development plan was on the 1st day of March 1965, submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

The proposal relates to the designation for compulsory acquisition of approximately 0.85 of an acre of land in the City of Durham comprising parts of Nos. 6, 7 and 8 Claypath, together with Nos. 9, 10, 11, 12 and 13 Claypath and the associated land to the rear.
