UNIVERSITIES OF OXFORD AND CAMBRIDGE ACT 1923

A Statute made by the Governing Body of Gonville and Caius College, in the University of Cambridge, on the 24th June 1965, has been submitted for the approval of Her Majesty in Council, and notice of its having been so submitted is published in accordance with the provisions of the Universities of Oxford and Cambridge Act 1923.

PRESENT,

The QUEEN'S Most Excellent Majesty in Council

Whereas it is in the interests of Her Majesty's Naval and Marine Forces that certain men who are serving on regular engagements should re-engage to complete time for pension and that a grant should be offered to them to do so:

Her Majesty, in exercise of the powers conferred upon Her by section 3 of the Naval and Marine Pay and Pensions Act 1865, and of all other powers enabling Her in that behalf, is pleased by and with the advice of Her Privy Council, to order, and it is hereby ordered, as follows:

A re-engagement grant will be paid to Leading rates and above, and Able rates qualified in all respects for Leading rate, in certain specified shortage categories who, while serving on their first engagements of 9 or 12 years re-engage on or after 11th March 1965 to complete time for pension. The amount of grant and the categories of ratings eligible for it are given in the Schedule to this Order.

3. 10% of the grant will be paid at the time of re-engaging and the remaining 90% will be paid on the first day of the 10th or 13th year of reckonable service.

4. Men serving in the categories listed in Clause 2 of this Schedule who prior to 11th March 1965, had already signed to complete 14 years' service will be eligible for the grant if they re-engage for pension before they have completed the full period of their initial engagement.

5. Men serving in the categories listed in Clause 2 of this Schedule who prior to 11th March 1965,
