From the Camp at Scalin, September 17. N. S.

**H**IS Royal Highness the Duke of Savoy and Prince Eugene arriv'd at this Camp on the 14th Instant, and the Troops have follow'd in their appointed Time and Order: The last Body which was expected is composed of Two German Brigades, commanded by the Duke of Wirtemberg, and join'd us Yesterday. This Morning a great Detachment from our Army began their March towards Susa; and to Morrow Prince Eugene will take the same Way at the Head of the other Troops, of which the Army is to be form'd, that is design'd for the Siege of that Place. His Royal Highness will also decamp from hence to Morrow with the other part of the Forces, in order to attack La Perouse and the Valley of St. Martin. The Hereditary Prince of Hesse-Cassel, with several other Officers of Distinction, who had been some Days at Turin, are return'd to their respective Commands. We hear, that the French have no considerable Body of Forces in Dauphiné; and that the Inhabitants of those Parts are in no manner of Apprehension of any further Enterprize his Royal Highness may engage in this Campagne, having receiv'd so many repeated Informations, from their publick Intelligence, That the Duke of Savoy had lost half his Army in the late Expedition on Provence.

**Berlin, October 1.** Letters from Poland inform us, That the Czar has made a late Proposal to the King of Sweden, in which he offers to restore all that he has taken during the War, and make Reparation for the Damage which has been sustain'd in it: But his Swedish Majesty would not incline to an Accommodation. Prince Ragotzi has signified to the King of Sweden, That the Czar and the Polish Nation were dispos'd to chuse him King of Poland, and desir'd his Majesty's Concurrence: But the King of Sweden answer'd, That the Poles had already a King, whom he was resolv'd to maintain against all Pretenders whatsoever. On Thursday last Count Zbor pass'd through this City on his Way to Vienna. His Swedish Majesty set him at Liberty without demanding of him any Engagement for his future Behaviour, only admonishing him, That the Emperor had answer'd for his Conduct hereafter. Letters from Warsaw of the 23d of September advise, That the General of the Crown return'd on the 16th to the Army, accompanied by Count Bevezini and other Deputies from Hungary. Prince Menzikoff takes frequent Reviews of the Troops at Blonie. Monsieur Goltz, who was formerly Go-

vernor of Dantzick, is made Vice-Marshal by his Czarish Majesty, and has follow'd that Prince into Lithuania. Monsieur Relinski is commanded to join the main Army with his Detachment from Prussia. Letters of the 16th from Posen say, That the advanc'd Guard of King Stanislaus was seen within 5 Miles of Lissa. The Plague continues to rage in Cracovia.

**Paris, October 3.** Monsieur de Chamartre, Governor of Sufa, has sent an Express to the Court with Advice, That the Army of the Duke of Savoy had fat down before that Place, and had already taken the Town, after having made themselves Masters of several of the Eminences which command it. At the departure of the Courier, the Enemy was making the necessary Dispositions for attacking the Castle in Form. There are in it Three Battalions, who retired upon the Loss of the Town, and are resolv'd to defend it to the last Extremity. The Marshal de Tessé lay within Three Leagues of that Place, and was gathering together a Body of Troops for its Succour. We have not for some time receiv'd any Account of the Siege of Lerida; but, by Letters lately arriv'd from Spain, we hear, That the opening of the Trenches, which had been fix'd to the 15th of the last Month, was deferr'd to the 25th, by reason of the swelling of the Segra, which had overflow'd its Banks, and bore away the Bridges that had been laid over it. The same Letters add, That Count Egmont, who commanded the Horse under the Duke of Orleans, was dead in the Camp, and very much regretted by the whole Army. He was descended in a right Line from the Sovereign Dukes of Gelderland, and dy'd without Issue. A Courier is lately arriv'd from the Marshal de Villars, with Advices which are kept very secret: But by Letters from Stratsbourg we are inform'd, That a Detachment from the Army of the Elector of Hanover had surpris'd a Body of our Cavalry, commanded by Lieutenant-General Vivans. The King has lately made a great Promotion of Officers for the Sea Service. The Prince of Conti, finding that his Letter to the Canton of Berne could not engage the Government of that Place in his Interest since his retiring from Neufchatel, has sent a Letter to the Four Catholick Cantons allied to that State, in which he desires them not to acknowledge the Sovereign who shall be elected by their Tribunal; and insinuates, That a Time might come when he should be able to assert his Right in a more powerful manner.

**Brussels, October 5.** By Letters from Madrid of the 10th we hear, That Don Joseph Chaves, a Brigadier-General, having laid Siege to the Castle of Alcoy in the Kingdom of Valencia, the Garrison, after a brave Defence, had capitulated to surrender the Place, unless they were reliev'd in Three Days: But that a Party of 400 Miquelets, who were detach'd from

Alicant, appearing at a distance, the Enemy, who believ'd they were follow'd by greater Numbers, rais'd the Siege, and retir'd with great Precipitation. The Garison at the same time fallied out, and, in conjunction with the Miquelets, fell upon them in their Retreat, and took several Prisoners, among whom was the Brigadier himself, who commanded the Siege.

*Hague, October 7. N. S.* Yesterday, at Nine in the Morning, his Grace the Duke of Marlborough arriv'd here, and in the Afternoon had a long Conference with the Deputies of the States, which was again renew'd this Morning. His Grace set out this Evening for the Army, where it is believ'd he will not stay longer than to give the necessary Orders for their marching into Winter-Quarters. Brigadier Palmes is arriv'd here on his Return from Italy. We have receiv'd the Confirmation of the Defeat of Lieutenant-General de Vivans by Count Mercy, who is since return'd to the Camp at Etingen with his Detachment, and the Prisoners whom he took in that Action. He hath brought with him a great Booty, in which is the Plate of Monsieur de Vivans, and 5000 Ducats in Money. Four Regiments of the Circle of Franconia, that were quarter'd in Bavaria, have join'd the Imperial Army. His Electoral Highness of Hanover hath reinforc'd the Garison of Landau with Six Battalions. We hear from Italy, That the Germans are in possession of the Castle of Pescara. The Capitulation for that Place consists of Eleven Articles; among which there is one in Favour of the Duke of Atri, allowing him Six Months to consider whether he will chuse to retire into France, or embrace the Interests of King Charles. The Siege of Gaeta is press'd with the utmost Vigour; and the Batteries have play'd upon the Town with good Effect, that all Things are preparing for a general Assault.

*London, Sept. 29.* This Day the Common Hall, according to Custom, proceeded to the Election of a Lord Mayor of this City; and having return'd Sir William Withers and Sir Charles Duncombe to the Court of Aldermen, they unanimously made Choice of Sir William Withers; who was accordingly declar'd Lord Mayor Elect for the Year ensuing.

*Whitehall, October 1.* Yesterday Her Majesty and His Royal Highness went from Kensington to Newmarket.

*His Royal Highness Prince George of Denmark, &c. Lord High Admiral of Great Britain and Ireland, &c. does command the Company belonging to Her Majesty's Ship the Dartmouth, Captain William Cock Commander, immediately to repair on board the said Ship at Woolwich, otherwise they will be taken up and try'd as Deserters, she being assign'd on present Service.*
