WE have received an Account of the taking of Ciudad-Rodrigo by Assault, in the following Manner: The Marquis de Bay, after having press'd the Siege for several Days, and reduced the Place to great Extremities, sent a Trumpet to the Governor, with a Summons to surrender, requiring an Answer in 3 Hours; whereupon the Governor call'd a Council of all the Officers, who met in the Castle, to debate upon the Subject. In the mean time the Marquis de Bay ordered 400 Men to attempt the Breach, who came to the Wall without being discovered, and finding but a small Body to oppose them, forc'd the Passage, and entred the Town, having put to the Sword about 50 or 60 common Soldiers in the first Fury of the Assault. They were quickly follow'd and supported by fresh Detachments of the Spanish Army, who oblig'd the Governor and Officers, with the Garrison that was left, to surrender at Discretion. This Action, according to the Representation of our Officers, very much reflects on the Honour of the Marquis de Bay, who attacked them before the Time was expired which he had allow'd them for an Answer to his Demand. Our Army that was before Moura, hearing that the Marquis de Bay, after having taken Ciudad Rodrigo, had pass'd the Tagus with Six Regiments of Horse, and would soon be joined by Four more from Andalusia, and Two that were near Badajos, retired from before that Place without having broken Ground. They afterwards repass'd the Guadiana, and are now encamped between Elvas and Olivença, in order to hinder the Marquis de Bay from making any Incurfion into Portugal. The Autumnal Rains have already begun to fall; so that, in all Probability, there will be no further Action on

either Side this Year; and our Generals are ordered to distribute the Troops into their Winter Quarters as soon as the Enemy have left the Field. Vice-Admiral Waisenaer arrived here with his Squadron the 19th Instant in the Morning; and in the Afternoon Captain Elways, with 6 British Men of War and a great many Transports under his Command, which are designed for Great Britain with the first Convoy from hence: By the freshest Advices we have from Catalonia we hear, the Enemy have opened their Trenches before Lerida, the Prince of Hesse being in the Place with a strong Garrison of Britains and Dutch. My Lord Galway was endeavouring to engage the whole Country to take up Arms, and making all possible Preparations to oblige the Enemy to raise the Siege. By Letters of a later Date from Alicant we hear, That the Miquelets were drawing together in a great Body, in order to join several Regiments of Militia, with a Design to make an Irruption into Arragon by the Way of Balbastro, and by that Means to divert the Duke of Orleans from his Enterprize upon Lerida. Some Letters also add, That it was generally thought his Royal Highness would be very glad of a Pretence for the raising of the Siege of that Place; having written several pressing Letters to the Courts of France and Spain, for fresh Recruits of Men and Supplies of Ammunition. The Catalonians appear more zealous than ever in the Interest of King Charles; and seem resolv'd to preserve their Liberties against the Invasion of the Enemy, or perish in the Defence of them. They are not a little animated to those Resolutions, by the Assurances they have received of being supported by speedy Succours from Italy.

Falmouth, Octob. 25. Yesterday arrived here Sir William Jumper, in Her Majesty's Ships the Lenox, Captain Johnson, in the Valeur, and Captain Sansom, in the Phoenix.

Bristol, Octob. 27. Yesterday came in the Diamond Galley of this Place from Jamaica, and the Amity from Barbadoes. Sixteen Sail of small Vessels from Corke arrived the same Day, under Convoy of Her Majesty's Ship the Bridgewater; and this Morning the Lucretia of Corke got into Harbour here, after having been separated from the other Vessels from Jamaica. On the 25th came into Kingroad the Whetstone Galley of this Place, Henry Green Commander, in 4 Weeks from Newfoundland, and brought with him several Ransomers for Prizes he had taken on the Banks of Newfoundland, with some Masters of British Vessels as Passengers that had been taken by the French, and exchanged at Newfoundland. Her Majesty's Ship the Garland is also arrived in that Road.

Portsmouth, Octob. 28. Yesterday Sir Geo. Byng, on Board the Royal Ann, and Sir John Norris, on Board the Torbay, failed into this Harbour from Spithead; as did also the Panther and Cruiser.

Deale, Octob. 28. Her Majesty's Ship Somerser, with the Vulcan and Gryphon Fireships, the Weasel Sloop and Isabella Yacht, is failed for the River.

London October 29. Yesterday Sir William Withers, Elected Lord Mayor of this City, was Sworn at Guildhall with the usual Ceremonies: And this Day his Lordship, being accompanied by the late Lord Mayor, the Recorder, Aldermen, and Sheriffs, in their Formalities, rode to the Water side, and from thence proceeded in the City Barge, attended by the several Companies in their respective Barges, adorn'd with Streamers and Pendants, to Westminster-Hall, where the Lord Mayor was Sworn, as usual, in the Court of Exchequer: After which they returned by Water to Black-Fryers Stairs, and from thence proceeded on Horseback, with the usual Solemnity, to Fishmongers Hall, where a splendid Entertainment was provided for the Lords and others of Her Majesty's most Honourable Privy Council, the Great Officers of State, the Judges, and other Persons of Quality, and performed with great Magnificence.

Whitehall, Octob. 29. Her Majesty has been graciously pleased to appoint his Grace the Duke of Devonshire Warden and Chief Justice in Eyre of all the Forests, Parks, Chaces, and Warrens, beyond Trent, and Lord Lieutenant and *Custos Rotulorum* of the County of Derby.
