Don Bernardo de Quiros has open'd to the States his Commission of Plenipotentiary from his Catholick Majesty. That Minister will dispatch a Courier to his Master to Morrow, to carry the Resolutions which are taken concerning the Palatine and other Troops defign'd for the Service in Catalonia. They write from Hamburgh, That General Patkull, late Minister of State, and Ambassador from his Czarish Majesty, was executed the 10th of last Month near the Convent of Casimir, between Posnanie and Slupeza, which at that time were the Head Quarters of the Swedish Army. Letters from Dresden inform us, That the Roman-Catholicks of Silesia, and particularly the Jesuits, very much oppose the Restitution of the Churches and Estates which have been taken from the Protestants: Upon which his Imperial Majesty has sent fresh Orders to his Commissioners to repair immediately to Breslaw, and take effectual Measures for putting the Treaty with the King of Sweden in Execution.
