Its effect is to extinguish part of a footpath running from Foulane Ends, Oakerthorpe to Bunkers Hill, Oakerthorpe, being a part which starts at point "A" on the map at the rear of the property known as Chesterfield Road Farm and runs north-west for a distance of 154 yards to point "B" on the map 50 yards south of the path's junction with Bunkers Hill.
