SUBMISSION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER

Rural District of Depwade (Long Stratton Footpath No. 11) Public Path Extinguishment Order, 1965

Notice is hereby given that the above Order was made on the 13th day of December 1965, and is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

The Order relates to land situate in the Parish of Long Stratton.

Its effect will be to extinguish the public right of way of undefined width but not exceeding three feet commencing at a point in Flowerpot Lane, Long Stratton, immediately to the west of "Manor Lodge" (marked "A" on the map) and proceeding in a northerly direction along the eastern boundaries of O.S. Parcels Nos. 69 and 23 and the western boundary of O.S. Parcel No. 24 and thence in an easterly direction along the northern boundary of O.S. Parcel No. 24 to a point in Manor Road, Long Stratton, immediately to the south of the grounds of the Long Stratton Secondary Modern School (marked "B" on the map)—a distance of approximately 1,470 feet.

DULVERTON RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Dulverton Rural District Council Public Footpath No. 11/7 Diversion Order, 1965

Notice is hereby given that on the 9th day of December 1965, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above Order.

Its effect is to divert that part of path No. 11/7 from Kitridge Lane to the main road (C.215) at a point adjacent to the School in Withypool which begins on the southern side of Kitridge Lane 1,050 feet north-west of the property known as Dadhays and runs for approximately 1,085 feet south-east through the curtilage of Summerhill along the eastern boundaries of fields O.S. No.'s 133 and 142 and through field O.S. No. 146, to a line beginning 20 feet east of the existing path's junction with Kitridge Lane and running 1,120 feet south-east along the western boundary of field O.S. No. 143 and diagonally across field O.S. No. 147 on the southern corner of which it rejoins the existing path.

The date for the closure of the section of the old footpath will be the 30th April 1966.
