Size, Nov. 8, N. S. The Pruffian Troops state to have their Winter Quarters in this They are expected every Moment. They are wrol the Forces which ferv'd this last Campagne Bebing and confift chiefly of Horse. The Chap-le hardinarch'd Commissaries to meet em on our footiers, and to direct their March to the feveral face appointed for their Reception; and Care is then in the Disposition of their Quarters, that they y lie ready to cover this Town from the French linies, which may make Incurfibns from Luxemburg,

and the Parts adjacent. There will be in this Place but one Regiment of Foot, and another of Horse, it being resolv'd, that a greater Number of Foreign Troops shall not be received into the City it self. Five Companies of Waler's Dragoons, which lay in Garison here, are to march within these two Days to join the rest of the Regiment at Liege. of Munfter is resolved to augment the Number of his Forces that are in the Service of the States Ge-neral. Letters from Vienna inform us, That the 28th of the last Month, being the Anniversary of the Birth of the Queen Dowager of Spain, was celebrated at the Imperial Court with great Magnifiz cence and Solemnity. The Cardinal of Saxe-Zeits was there on his Return from Presbourg, where he had been install'd Primate of Hungary. Eugene is expected at Court on the 20th of this Month, to affift at a Council of War. His Imperial Majesty, at the Instance of the King of Sweden, has re-instated Count Zobor in his Charge of Chame berlain, and all the Honours and Employments which he enjoy'd before his late Difgrace. These Letters add, That the Malecontents of Hungary had made an Attempt to seize the Castle of Besca, but were repuls'd with considerable Loss. General Staremberg intended to go to Presbourg, and give our some necessary Orders before he return'd to Vienna. By our last Letters from Berlin we are inform'd That the King of Prussia had declar'd himself highly obliged to the Queen of Great Britain and the States of Holland, for the good Offices their respective Envoys had done him in his Prerensions on the Sovereignty of Neufchatel; and that his Prussian Majesty expected every Moment to hear that the Tribunal of that Place had passed Sentence in his Favour. The French King's Minister having lately presented a Memorial, in which he had mention'd the King of Sweden in a disrespectful manner, we hear the Court of Berlin have transmitted a Copy of that Memorial to his Swedish Majesty. By Letters from Francfort of the 6th Instant we are inform'd, that the Elector of Hanover intended very suddenly to pass by that Place, in his way to Hanover, where his Electoral Highest deligns to refide part of the Winter. There have pass d laiely by Francfort several Boats with Recruits for the Troops of that Prince. The Elector of Mayence was still at Aschaffenburg. The same Letters add. That the French Army, before it repais'd the Rhine, had demolish'd all the Lines which they had cast up for the Defence of their Camp between Rastadt and Kuppenheim.
