CONFIRMATION OF PUBLIC PATH ORDER HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959.

Fareham Urban District Council (Footpath No. 75) Public Path Diversion Order, 1965

Notice is hereby given that on the 10th day of January 1966, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed with modifications the above

Its effect is to divert the public right of way running from the north side of the pond at Newlands Farm, Stubbington, in a north-north-easterly direction for approximately 2,130 feet through agricultural land to Longfield Avenue, Fareham, to a line running from a point commencing approximately 900 feet east-south-east of the existing path at the junction of Stroud Lane and Tanners Lane, and running in east-sount-east of the existing path at the junction of Stroud Lane and Tanners Lane, and running in a north-north-easterly direction along a line following the western boundary of H.M.S. Collingwood for about 1,790 feet, then north-westwards on the south side of the ditch for a distance of approximately 180 feet, and then north-north-easterly for a distance of approximately 150 feet to Longfield Avenue, Farcham. The old path will be closed from the 10th April 1966.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, Lloyds Bank Chambers, 43 West Street, Farcham, between 8.45 a.m. and 5.15 p.m. on Mondays—Fridays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 18th of January 1966, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made therein has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the

Order, he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
