TENDERS FOR TREASURY BILLS

1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday, the 11th March 1966, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £200,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 14th March 1966, to Saturday the 19th March 1966, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that They have made an Order under section 2 (3) of the Purchase Tax Act 1963 viz.:

The Purchase Tax (No. 1) Order 1966.

This Order consolidates the list of drugs and medicines which were free of purchase tax at the date of the making of this Order. The list supersedes the existing list shown in the Purchase Tax (No. 2) Order 1964 and includes the items subsequently exempted from tax by directions of the Commissioners of Customs and Excise under section 17 (3) of the Purchase Tax Act 1963.

The Order does not exempt any additional substance or cancel any existing exemption, but some items previously listed under their chemical names now appear under the names approved by the British Pharmacopoeia Commission, and some additions and deletions have been made consequent on the revision of previous entries.

The Order comes into operation on 8th March 1966 and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1966 No. 208.
