#### WORCESTER CITY COUNCIL

City of Worcester (Various Streets) (Prohibition of Waiting) (No. 1) Order, 1965

Notice is hereby given that on the 4th day of March 1966, the Council made an Order under sections 26 and 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which is:

- (1) To prohibit at all times the waiting of vehicles in the lengths of roads specified in the First Schedule hereto.
- (2) To restrict the waiting of vehicles to 45 minutes in any period of two hours between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. from Mondays to Saturdays inclusive on the lengths of roads specified in the Second Schedule hereto.
- (3) To prohibit waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. from Mondays to Saturdays inclusive on the lengths of road specified in the Third Schedule hereto.

The proposed Order contains the usual exceptions allowing persons to board or alight from vehicles, allowing vehicles to be loaded or unloaded and to be used in connection with any funeral, building operation or work on or adjoining the said lengths of road.

## FIRST SCHEDULE

Bank Street from its junction with High Street for a distance of forty-five feet South. 4. Bank Street from its junction with Augus and the street from its junction with High Street to its junction with Powick Lane in a westerly and southerly direction. 6. Castle Street from its junction with the Tything and Foregate Street to its junction with Severn Terrace and Croft Road. 7. Infirmary Walk from its junction with Castle Street for a distance of 318 feet in a southerly direction. South. North and South. East. in a southerly direction. 8. Infirmary Walk from a point 115 feet south of its junction with Castle Street for a distance of 203 feet in a southerly direction. 9. Silver Street from its junction with Lowesmoor in a southerly direction to a West.
