HIGHWAYS ACT 1959

The Newport—Shrewsbury Trunk Road (Sun Pitch Diversion) Order 1966

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he has made an Order under sections 7 and 44 of the above Act providing-

(a) that a road which he proposes to construct at Llanvihangel Crucorney in the Rural District of Abergavenny in the county of Monmouth shall become a trunk road on the date when the Order comes into operation, and
