The French having continued to deraten Neufchatel with an Invasion, and a considemble Number of Troops being actually arriv'd in the Franche-Compté, to take their Winter-Quarters fere, Count Metternich has put the Country in a follure of Defence, and fent a Regiment of 1200 Men, drawn out of the Miliria, under the Command of experienced Officers, to guard the Passages of the Frontiers. Diet of the Protestant Cantons met at Langhenthal, no Leagues off this Place, in order to take effectual Measures for the further Security of Neufchatel, and the Peace of Switzerland; and it is believ'd a Deputation went this Day from that Assembly to the French Ambassador, according to the Third Demand. We hear Monsieur Puisseux is recall'd from hence; as is also Monsieur de Graville from the Grisons. On the 8th Instant Three Deputies arriv'd here from Neufchatel, to return the Compliment this Canton made Count Metternich by their folemn Deputation; and, having had their Audience Yesterday, are this Day set out for Langhenthal, with the Deputies of this Canton, to be present at the Deliberations of the General Diet. It does not yet appear that France designs to commit Hostilities against Neuschatel; but whatever is intended from thence, the Principality is under no Apprehensions of a Surprize, there having fallen so great a Quantity of Snow, as renders any Expedition at present impracticable: Besides that, they have made all necessary Preparations for their

Copenhagen, Dec. 17. Monsieur Ishmaelhoff, the Muscovite Ambassador, who has resided in this Court with that Character for 7 Years, had Yesterday his Audience of Leave. The Ceremony with which that Minister was received was very particular; but conformable to the Manner in which Danish Ministers have been complimented at Moscow. At the Door of the Chamber of Audience, the Ambassador and all his Attendants deliver'd their Swords: After which his Excellency was conducted into the King's Pre-fence, and receiv'd by his Majeity fitting with his Hat on. The Ambassador expressed himself in Ita-lian: His Majesty's Answer was given by a Privy-Councellor in Danish; the King only adding a few Words in Confirmation of what his Minister had said. The Ministers of the Guarantees for the Treaty of Travendahl, now affembled at Hamburgh, having re-presented, That they could not employ their good Offices between the two contending Parties, unless they had Admission to the Conferences with their Com-missioners, which was not allow'd by the Danish Deputies; Mr. Pulteny, Envoy Extraordinary from Her British Majesty, and the Minister from the States General, have made their Application to his Majesty on that behalf; and the King was pleas'd to say, He would give his Commissioners such Orders as they desir'd.
