**T**HE Regiment of the Croix Blanche has march'd into this City, where it is to quarter during the Winter; and the Regiment of Savoy began its March from hence on the same Day, in order to lie at Sufa till the opening of the next Campaign. The Envoy from the States General has received Orders from their High Mightinesses for the Embarkation of the Palatine Horse to serve in Spain. The State of Milan has appointed the Marquis de Castiglione, and the Count d'Oppitone, to wait upon his Catholick Majesty at Barcelona, in order to sollicite the Confirmation of their Privileges, and lay before his Majesty many other Matters which concern the Good of his Subjects in that Duchy. The Marquis de Courance arriv'd here two Days ago from Alexandria, where he is succeeded in his Command by the Marquis d'Andour; And it is said the former will be sent to the Imperial Court in the Character of Envoy Extraordinary. The Emperor's Minister here has notified to his Royal Highness his Master's Consent to treat for an Equivalent instead of the Vigevano; and declar'd, That his Imperial Majesty will name Commissioners for that Negotiation, as soon as the Duke declares who shall act on his Royal Highness's Part in that Affair. Letters of the 25th Instant, from on board Sir Thomas Dilks off Corfica, say, He was then making for Leghorne, where it is suppos'd he is at present arriv'd, with the British and Dutch Ships under his Command.

**Berne, Dec. 14.** The French having continued to threaten Neufchatel with an Invasion, and a considerable Number of Troops being actually arriv'd in the Franche-Compté, to take their Winter-Quarters there, Count Metternich has put the Country in a Posture of Defence, and sent a Regiment of 1200 Men, drawn out of the Militia, under the Command of experient'd Officers, to guard the Passages of the Frontiers. That Minister has taken all necessary Precautions for the Security of the Country: And when the Ambassadors from the Canton of Berne were sent to congratulate his Master's Accession to that Principality, he demanded the Three following Points; 1. That the Canton of Berne would give 200 Men to serve on the Frontiers, as a publick Testimony that they took the Country into their Protection. 2. That they should give Orders to their Militia to march without Delay to the Succour of Neufchatel, whenever they see their Beacons fir'd. And 3. That when these Dispositions are made and executed, the Canton would send a Deputation to Monsieur Puisieux, to explain with him concerning the French King's Design on that Subject, and demand a definitive Answer, Whether that Prince is willing that the Country of Neufchatel shall remain in a Neutrality with him or not? These Articles being expressly contain'd in the Treaty of Combourg between Bern and Neufchatel, are punctually comply'd with, notwithstanding the Endeavours of the French to the contrary. On the 11th Instant a

Diet of the Protestant Cantons met at Langenthal, 10 Leagues off this Place, in order to take effectual Measures for the further Security of Neufchatel, and the Peace of Switzerland; and it is believ'd a Deputation went this Day from that Assembly to the French Ambassador, according to the Third Demand. We hear Monsieur Puisieux is recall'd from hence; as is also Monsieur de Graville from the Grisons. On the 8th Instant Three Deputies arriv'd here from Neufchatel, to return the Compliment this Canton made Count Metternich by their solemn Deputation; and, having had their Audience Yesterday, are this Day set out for Langenthal, with the Deputies of this Canton, to be present at the Deliberations of the General Diet. It does not yet appear that France designs to commit Hostilities against Neufchatel; but whatever is intended from thence, the Principality is under no Apprehensions of a Surprise, there having fallen so great a Quantity of Snow, as renders any Expedition at present impracticable: Besides that, they have made all necessary Preparations for their Defence.

**Copenhagen, Dec. 17.** Monsieur Ishmaelhoff, the Muscovite Ambassador, who has resided in this Court with that Character for 7 Years, had Yesterday his Audience of Leave. The Ceremony with which that Minister was received was very particular; but conformable to the Manner in which Danish Ministers have been complimented at Moscow. At the Door of the Chamber of Audience, the Ambassador and all his Attendants deliver'd their Swords: After which his Excellency was conducted into the King's Presence, and receiv'd by his Majesty sitting with his Hat on. The Ambassador expressed himself in Italian: His Majesty's Answer was given by a Privy-Councillor in Danish; the King only adding a few Words in Confirmation of what his Minister had said. The Ministers of the Guarantees for the Treaty of Travendahl, now assembled at Hamburgh, having represented, That they could not employ their good Offices between the two contending Parties, unless they had Admission to the Conferences with their Commissioners, which was not allow'd by the Danish Deputies; Mr. Pulteny, Envoy Extraordinary from Her British Majesty, and the Minister from the States General, have made their Application to his Majesty on that behalf; and the King was pleas'd to say, He would give his Commissioners such Orders as they desir'd.

**Hague, Dec. 23. N. S.** The Commotions which have of late been rais'd in the Province of Guelderland are quieted. The Town of Arnhem has receiv'd Troops; and the States have plac'd a Burgomaster and two or three Magistrates who retir'd hither. Nimeguen has sent Propositions to the States of Guelderland, assembled at Tiel, in order to incline that Body to fall in with the Resolutions of the States General; and there is a Time fix'd within which these Differences are to be determin'd. They of Guelderland have separated without declaring themselves on that Subject; but being to assemble the next Month, it is not doubted but that the Affair will be wholly adjust'd within the limited Time.
