THE TRUNK ROAD (ABERGELE) (PROHIBITION OF WAITING) (AMENDMENT) ORDER 1966.

Notice is hereby given that the Secretary of State intends to make an Order under section 28 of the Road Traffic Act 1960, the effect of which will be to amend the Trunk Road (Main Street, Abergele) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1960, and the Trunk Road (Abergele) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1962, so that instead of vehicles being prohibited from waiting only in the months of May to September in any of the lengths of road specified in the Schedule hereto, vehicles will be prohibited from waiting in any of these lengths throughout the year.

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to enable a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary for a person to board or alight from the vehicle; to enable goods to be loaded on to or unloaded from the vehicle; to enable the vehicle to be used in connection with any building operation or demolition, the removal of any obstruction to traffic, the maintenance of the road or the services therein.
