DUNMOW RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

The Rural District of Dunmow (White Street, Great Dunmow) (Parking Places) Order, 1966

Notice is hereby given that the Dunmow Rural District Council propose to make an Order under section 81 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, and subsection 2 of Schedule 11 of the Road Traffic and Roads Improvement Act, 1960, the effect of which will be to authorise the use of the lengths of White Street in the Parish of Great Dunmow described in the Schedule hereto as parking places for private motor cars for a maximum period of 20 minutes in any one hour between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays, and for unlimited periods on Sundays and between the hours of 6 p.m. and 8 a.m. on Mondays to Saturdays.

The Council proposes for preventing obstruction of the Street to reserve the power to close any such parking places on the occasion of public processions and at certain other times.

Situation of Parking Place

West side from a point 180 feet southeast of its junction with Market Place south-eastwards for a distance of 75 feet.

East side:

(a) from a point 320 feet south-east of its junction with Market Place, southwards for a distance of 18 feet.

(b) from a point 349 feet south-east of its junction with Market Place, southwards for a distance of 39 feet.

(c) from a point 396 feet south-east of its junction with Market Place, southwards for a distance of 34 feet.

ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

Imposition of 30 m.p.h. and 40 m.p.h. Speed Limits

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Essex intend to apply to the Minister of Transport for her consent to the making of Orders:

- (a) under the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be that the lengths of road specified in the First Schedule to this notice shall become subject to a speed limit of 30 m.p.h.; and
- (b) under section 11 (1) of the Road Traffic Act, 1962, prohibiting the driving of motor vehicles at a speed exceeding 40 m.p.h. on the length of road specified in the Second Schedule to this notice.

Any objection to the making of the Orders should be sent to the Clerk of the Council at County Hall, Chelmsford, not later than 1st July 1966.

FIRST SCHEDULE

(1) That length of the Boxmoor—Maldon Road (A.414) at Great Baddow in the Rural District of Chelmsford, which extends from a point 20 yards west of its junction with Jeffery Road in an easterly direction to a point 8 yards east of its junction with Baddow Hall Crescent (West);

(2) That length of Molrams Lane (Class III) at Great Baddow aforesaid, which extends from a point 120 yards south of its junction with route A.414 in a northerly direction for a distance of 60 yards; and

(3) That length of Galleywood Road (Class III) at Great Baddow aforesaid, which extends from a point 5 yards west of Pitt Chase in a general westerly direction for a distance of 355 yards.

SECOND SCHEDULE

That length of the Boxmoor—Maldon Road (A.414) at Great Baddow in the Rural District of Chelmsford, which extends from a point 8 yards east of its junction with Baddow Hall Crescent (West) in an easterly direction for a distance of 440 yards to a point 90 yards east of its junction with Baddow Hall Crescent (East).

ESSEX COUNTY COUNCIL

The County of Essex (White Street, Great Dunmow) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order 1966

Notice is hereby given that the County Council of Essex propose to make an Order under section 26 of the Road Traffic Act 1960 the effect of which will be to prohibit the waiting of vehicles between the hours of 8 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays in the following lengths of White Street, Great Dunmow:

(1) *West side*—

(a) from its junction with Market Place in a general south easterly direction for a distance of 180 feet;

(b) from its junction with High Street in a northerly direction for a distance of 330 feet;

(2) *East side*—

(a) from its junction with Market Place in a general south easterly direction for a distance of 320 feet;

(b) from its junction with High Street in a northerly direction for a distance of 210 feet.

Exceptions will be contained in the Order authorising a vehicle to wait for a person to board or alight or for goods to be loaded or unloaded, or in connection with building operations or the repair and maintenance of the road or of the various services therein.

Objections to the proposal must be sent in writing to the undersigned by 1st July 1966.
