Lisbon, January 16. N.S.

I S Portuguese Majesty has named the Marquis de Frontera General in the Alentejo, to the great Satisfaction of the whole Army. Our last Advices from Catalonia lay, That the Enemy and retir'd into Winter-Quarters; and that the shops of King Charles had follow'd their Example. His Catholick Majesty is taking all possible Measures for making the greatest Advantage of the Succours inpeded from Italy.

Terin, January 4. On the first Instant his Royal Highness, the Dutchess Downger and Dutchess Confort, receiv'd the usual Compliments from all the Court, and Foreign Ministers residing in it. The Mirquis de Courtance, Governor of Alexandria, left this lace the same Day, in order to go for Vienna, his Royal Highness having been pleas'd to appoint Tim his Envoy Extraordinary to his Imperial Majesty. The French that are at la Perouse, notwithstanding the Loss they sustain'd in their last Attempt upon Wiley of Lucerne, having given out that they desire make another Irruption, and put the convergence of the contribution, his Royal limited hath fent his Gardes du Corps into Quarthe Barges and Bagnols, which are not above the Miles from Lucerne, to affift the Vaudois mon the first Motion of the Enemy. Monsieur de Beleistel, at his Royal Highness's Request, went from hence Yesterday for Lucerne, to give necessary Orders for the Protection of the Country, with which he is well acquainted. Our last Letters from Mado fay, That on the first Instant the Milsord, a March of War. Commission Standard Country. Smilh Man of War, Captain Stanhope Commander, and from thence for Barcelona, with Letters to his Smilk Majesty; and that on the same Day, about four of the Clock in the Afternoon, the other Men of War set Sail, but lay by in the Night till all the Transports were out of the Bay, and then put to Sea. Vienna, January 11. Circular Letters are preparing to summon all the States of Hungary with ensuing Diet at Presburg; and necessary. Precautions are taken both by this Court and the Milecontents, that no Surprize may happen to be Prejudice of either Side. Count Berezini is fined with a very strong Body of Men near Newhings, and the Hungarians preserve a free Communction between the Upper and Lower Hungary, by guarding a Pass near the Fort of Karwar, and mother at Fedwar, below Buda, both on the Dambe. Alba-Regalis is fill close block'd up by the Malecontents, and they have lately reinforced the Blockade with some Cavalry. All Things are quiet on the Frontiers near Pein-waradin; and that Monsieur Guarient was then Carlowitz, preparing all Things for the Election of a new Patriarch for the Rascian Nation. Geneal Zumzingen is arriv'd from Italy. A Party of 120 German Foot were lately fent out of Oeden-burg to surprise an Hungarian Party which lay in a har that Place, and executed their Defign har failly; but were themselves intercepted on their Reinri, and taken Prisoners by a great Body of Malecontents.

Berne, January 14. The Troops this Canton bath fent into the Principality of Neufchatel, are now arriv'd upon the Frontiers of Franche Comté, and have join'd the Militia of Neufchatel. The whole confifts of rooso Men, furnish'd with 10 Field-pieces, necessary Ammunition, and all other Utenfils of War. This Army is commanded by Mafils of War. This Army is commanded by Ma-jor-General Tscharner, accompanied by Two De-puties, who are to affift at all the Deliberations of the Council of War. The Troops are in very good Condition, and observe a perfect Order and Disci-The Grisons have order'd 3000 Men to be in a readiness for a March, to sustain the other Auxiliaries already sent by this Canton; and the Canton of Glaris have resolved to give a like Number of Troops upon the first Alarm. We have no fresh Advices of the Motions of the French in Franche Comté; and 'tis probable, the good Posture of Defence we are in, will make the Enemy turn these Appearances of War into a Negociation of Neutrality at the General Diet which is to meet on the 16th; from whence we expect foon to hear what the French Ambassidor shall have proposid.

Berlin, January 14. His Mzjesty's Indiposition seem'd some Days ago to have been very much abated; but he has fince had a violent Relapse, which has lest him very weak. Yesterday the Prince Royal, accompanied by the Three Margraves, and some Officers, went to Sarmund, in order to meet the Prince of Anhalt there, and review the Detachment which the Prince has brought out of Italy to convoy the Recruits for the next Campagne into the Field. That Detachment is to be disposed into severai Quarters, to take care of the Recruits already rais'd for the Battalions upon Service. Bach Commanding Officer applies to earneftly to the Court for the March of the Troops under his Command our of Italy, that the King has declar'd, He will put an End to their Sollicitations, and let that Matter be decided by Lot. In the mean time his Majesty has resolved. That Three Battalions, now marching out of Prussia, shall be sent into Italy, in Exchange for the same Number which will be recalled from thence. Monsieur Brand is appointed by his Majesty to receive the Oaths of Fidelity from the Inhabitants of Crossen, in the Name of the Princels Royal, on whom the King has fettled that Principality, as Part of her Jointure; and the Elector of Hanover has order'd his Relident here to accompany Monsieur Brand on that Occasion. We hear Monsieur Ilten is to set out from Hanover on the 20th Instant, with the Character of Envoy Extraor-dinary from his Electoral Highness to the King of Pruffia; and 'tis faid, that Minister is to comply with the Ceremony lately establish'd in this Court. Orders are given for transporting Colonel Schlund, who is Prisoner at Spandaw, to Peitz, that he may have the Liberty of converfing with his Family, which it is not thought fit to allow him in the Place of his present Confinement. His Majesty has re-ceived Letters from the King of Sweden, wherein he assures the King, That he understands the Re-form'd to be as fully included as the Lutherans in his late Treaty, with the Emperor, under the Ex-pression of those of the Confession of Augsburg; and thaz
