WALLASEY DEVELOPMENT PLAN

Amendment ; Land in the vicinity of Tarran Way, Pasture Road, Moreton, Wallasey

Notice is hereby given that proposals for alterations or additions to the above Development Plan were on the 1st day of July 1966 submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government.

The proposals comprise the re-allocation of land for industrial purposes at present allocated primarily for residential and clay working purposes, and relate to approximately 15 acres of land in the vicinity of Tarran Way on the west side of Pasture Road, Moreton in the County Borough of Wallasey.

A certified copy of the proposals as submitted has been deposited for public inspection at the Town Clerk's Office, Town Hall, Wallasey.

The copy or extract of the proposals so deposited, together with a copy of the Development Plan, are available for inspection free of charge by all persons interested at the place mentioned above between 8.40 a.m. and 5.30 p.m. from Monday to Friday each week inclusive.

Any objection or representation with reference to the proposals may be sent in writing to the Secretary, Minister of Housing and Local Government, Whitehall, London S.W.1, before the 15th day of August 1966, and any such objection or representation should state the grounds on which it is made and identify the land to which it relates. Persons making an objection or representation may register their names and addresses with the Wallasey County Borough Council and will then be entitled to receive notice of any amendment to the Development Plan made as a result of the proposals.

County Borough of Darlington Revised Definitive Map and Statement

Notice is hereby given that the Council of the County Borough of Darlington in exercise of the powers conferred upon them have prepared a Revised Definitive Map and Statement in connection with the second review carried out by them in accordance with sections 30 to 34 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949.

The said map and statement may be inspected free of charge at the Town Hall, Darlington, between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m. on any weekday other than Saturday.

The Revised Definitive Map and Statement become operative on the date on which notice is published, but if application is made to the High Court under Part III of the First Schedule to the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, within a period of six weeks from that date by any person the Court may make an Order declaring that the Revised Definitive Map and Statement shall not be conclusive evidence of any such matter as may be specified in the Order.

AMPTHILL RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Amphill Rural District Footpath No. 8 Milton Bryan Public Path Diversion Order, 1966

Notice is hereby given that on the 24th June 1966 the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed, with modifications, the above Order.

Its effect will be to divert the public right of way from a line commencing at point A opposite the Town Pond and 20 feet north of the brook running in a north-easterly direction for approximately 90 feet to point B and then veering east for a distance of approximately 185 feet to the footbridge at point C, a total distance of 275 feet, to a line commencing at point E at the southern end of the Smithy, running in a north-easterly direction inside the boundary of Field No. 167 for a distance of approximately 220 feet to point D where it meets the stream, turning north over the stream then turning north-easterly and running approximately 60 feet parallel with the stream to the footbridge at point C, a total distance of 280 feet. A footbridge will be provided at point D.

The existing path will be closed as from the 20th August 1966.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, 12 Dunstable Street, Amphill, Beds., between 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 5 p.m. Mondays to Fridays.

The Order becomes operative as from the 5th July 1966 but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highway Act 1959, or on the grounds that any requirement of the Act or any regulations made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.

NEWARK RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

Newark Rural District Council (Girton Footpath No. 2) Diversion Order, 1966

Notice is hereby given that on the 20th day of June 1966, the Minister of Housing and Local Government confirmed the above Order.

Its effect will be to divert the public right of way leading from Girton to South Clifton through land in the parish of Girton on the eastern side of the River Trent commencing at point A in field O.S. No. 208 Sheet No. XXV-4 approximately 730 feet north of the junction of the Flood Bank with the road to Girton and proceeding in a north-north-easterly direction to point B on the northern boundary of field O.S. No. 36 Sheet No. XX-16 a distance of approximately 1,410 feet to a line commencing at the said point A and proceeding in a north-east and north-north-easterly direction not more than 110 feet east of the existing footpath and terminating at the said point B a distance of approximately 1,430 feet. The old footpath will be extinguished as from the 18th day of July 1966.

A copy of the confirmed Order and the map contained in it has been deposited at and may be inspected free of charge at the Council Offices, 21 Lombard Street, Newark, from 9 a.m. to 5 p.m. daily from Monday to Friday.

The Order becomes operative as from the 2nd day of July 1966, but if any person aggrieved by the Order desires to question the validity thereof or of any provision contained therein on the grounds that it is not within the powers of the Highways Act, 1959, or on the ground that any requirement of the Act or any regulation made thereunder has not been complied with in relation to the approval of the Order he may, within six weeks from the date of publication of this notice, make application to the High Court.
