The Dier at B. den is yet come to no Refourtion upon the French Ambalfador's Propefal of fequestring Neufchatel into the Hands of the 13 Cantons: But the Deputies from hence have openly declated, That this Canton will defend that Principality with their utmost Force it it should be attacked; and that they will hearken to no Meatures which may encroach upoh its Sovereignty. They have at the same time protessed, That they are prepared to enter into a Treaty of Neurality for that Country, and accordingly offered themselves to be Guarantees. The Deputies of the other Protestant Cantons adhere to this Retolutions, but though the Roman Catholicks, have not yet given that Opinion in this Affair, the French Ambassador has so little Hopes of gaining a Majority of them to his Masser's Interviss, that he has already altered his Language on this subject, and gives Intimations of some other more acceptable Expedient, which he has not yet communicated to the Afsembly.

The Habingers have received Orders to prepare all things necessary for his Majesty's Reception at Ualsbad, against the latter End of April: About which Time the Court will go thither for 6 Weeks: And tis faid King Augustus will make his Majesty a Visir there. The Prince of Holstein, who commands all his Majesty's Troops in Prussia, thas complained to the King of certain Disorders committed by a Party of Polanders, who attempted to recover by Force a Person who had taken Reiuge within the Dominions of Prussia. That Prince has further represented, That it is not for the King's Service to withdraw from thence so many of his Troops as is was intended. Two Regiments of Horse, commanded by the Margrave Philip and Major-General Durstin, which were marching out of Prussia, with other Forces, are hereupon connermanded. The eBartalions of Foot and two Regiments of Dragoons have aiready passed the Vistula, and continue their March-to this Place with as much Expedition as the Scason will permit. Besides an urgent Letter from the States General, delivered by their Envoy to the King, concerning the early Preparations which are necessary for the Defence of the Empire against the vigorous Efforts of the Enemy, his Maj-sty has received another from his Elector has from the States General, delivered by their Envoy to the King, concerning the early Preparations which are necessary from the Defence of the Empire against the vigorous Efforts of the Ememy, his Maj. sty has received another from his Electoral Highness of Hanover to the same Effect. The Elector has fent Instructions to his Envoy to act in concert with the Ministers of Great Britain and Helland, to persuade this Court to receive the 6000 Men offered by King Augustus, and obtain their good Offices with other Princes to bring them to the same Resolution. His Electoral Highness has also represented at large to the Diet of Ranisbonne the present Necessity of Assars, and in very sorcible Terms endeavoured to quicken their Resolutions: A Copy of which Letter the Elector has transmitted to the King. Letters from Warsaw of the 17th say. That Monstert Pulniatowsky, Colonel of King Stansslaus's Horse-Guards, was arrived there, and brought Advice, That his Master has pisted the Vistula. They write from Minsk of the 13th Instruct, That the Czar was expected there on the 21th; and that he has oldered 26000 Men to be raised, and joined with the 4000 who were levied before his Arrival at M. scow. We are advised from Wilda, That the Alsembly of the Confederates, which was summoned thither is now to meet at Minsk, for their greater Security.
