Cowes, Feb. 4. We hear, That the Dutch Fleet from Holland are now coming in at St. Hellens.

Portsmouth, Feb. 5. Yesterday the Dutch Lisbon Fleet arrived at St. Hellens, under the Convoy of 4th Men of War, being about 70th Sail of Merchantmen and Transports. Sir John Leake continues still at Spithead, on Board Her Majesty's Ship the Albemarle; as also Sir John Norris, on Board the Ranelagh; and Sir Edward Whitaker, on Board the Northumberland; with Her Majesty's Ships the Naf-yaw, Kent, Swallow, Adventure, Croiser, the Suffolk Hag-boat, and the Hunter Fire-ship.
