

five Dutch Men of War. Yesterday Her Majesty's Ship the Panther fail'd from Spithead through the Needles to the Westward.

*Deal, Febr. 26.* Yesterday in the Afternoon came down Her Majesty's Ships the Monmouth, Medway, Crown, Advice, Lark, Leopard, Falkland, Worcester, Dreadnaught, Jersey, Bonaventure, Ludlow-Castle, and Penzance. Last Night also came in hither from Spithead Her Majesty's Ships the Weymouth, Berwick, Swallow, Adventure, Gosport, Cruiser, Hunter Fireship, and three Dutch Men of War. Here lay also Her Majesty's Ships the Charham, Lyme, Mermaid and Nightingal.

*Deal, Febr. 27.* Yesterday fail'd the Mary and Elizabeth, and the Providence Storeships, for Dover. This Morning all her Majesty's Ships which lay here failed for the Coast of Dunkirk. About the same time came in her Majesty's Ships the Roebuck, Glasgow, Queensborough and Squirrel.

*Graveling-Pitts, Febr. 28.* O. S. Yesterday at Noon Sir George Bing came to an anchor here. As soon as he arriv'd he went into a small Frigate, and fail'd within two Miles of Flemish Road, from whence he had a Prospect of the Ships which lay there. He observ'd 27 fail small and great, one of 60 Guns, and three of 50, the rest under 20; they lay with their Topmasts loose, and between 40 and 50 Ships within the Heads above the Forcs, two or three of which appeared to be large. There were not in the Bason more than three Ships, one of 'em unrigg'd, and another had a white Flag at the Mainmast Head. This day a Fisherman was taken off the Shore, who reports that there is in Flemish Road 32 Ships; that the greatest is not yet Equipp'd; that the least of them carry 18 Guns; that some in the Peer are yet unfitt'd; that 10000 Men are in and about Dunkirk ready to embark; that they expect every Day Ships from Brett; and that soon after our arrival the Pretended Prince of Wales was arriv'd at Graveling in his way to Dunkirk.
