COMMISSION OF INQUIRY

Notice by the Commission of Inquiry appointed by the Minister of Labour to inquire into and report on the questions whether either the Hair, Bass and Fibre Wages Council (Great Britain) or the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Great Britain) or both of them should be abolished.

The Minister of Labour (hereinafter referred to as The Minister of Labour (hereinanter referred to as "the Minister") is considering whether he should exercise his powers under section 4 of the Wages Councils Act 1959 (hereinafter referred to as "the Act") to abolish the Hair, Bass and Fibre Wages Council (Great Britain) or the Brush and Broom Wages Council (Great Britain) or both of them.
