PUBLIC HEALTH (IMPORTED FOOD) REGULATIONS 1937 and 1948

Hungary

The Minister of Agriculture, Fisheries and Food gives notice in pursuance of the above-named Regulations that he hereby recognises for the purpose of the importation of meat and meat products from the Hungarian People's Republic the Official Certificate of which particulars are given in the Schedule hereto showing—

- (a) that the meat to which it relates, or the meat from which the meat product to which it relates was prepared, was derived from animals inspected ante- and post-mortem and passed in accordance with criteria satisfactory to the Minister, and
- (b) that all necessary precautions for the prevention of danger to public health were taken in the dressing or preparing of the meat or meat product.

The Certificate being in the form of a label or stamp, recognition will apply only if the label is securely affixed to the meat or the packages containing the meat or meat products, and if the label has not in any other circumstances or on any other occasion been used as an Official Certificate; and where the certificate is in the form of a stamp, the recognition will apply only if the stamp is clearly impressed on the meat or container.

The Official Certificate reproduced in the Schedule to the notice published in the *London Gazette* of 12th November 1957 will continue to be recognised in addition to the Certificate in the Schedule hereto until 1st February 1967, from which date it is hereby revoked.

SCHEDULE

A label or stamp having on it a design and certificate in the form set out below, the certificate being completed by the insertion of the place and date of inspection, the signature of the Veterinary Inspector, and the number of the establishment.

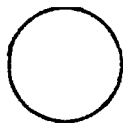
