

## BEDFORD COUNTY

*National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949**Survey of Public Rights of Way*

Notice is hereby given that the Bedfordshire County Council, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by subsection (3) of section 29 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, have determined to modify the particulars contained in the Draft Map and Statement prepared under section 27 of the above-mentioned Act in relation to the rights of way within that part of the County of Bedford consisting of the Bedford Rural District by the deletion, addition or other alteration of or in respect of the public paths and roads so used which are listed in the Schedule hereto and which are more particularly delineated and described in the Modified Draft Map, Statement and Schedule of Modifications which have been deposited at the Shire Hall, Bedford, and at the Bedford R.D.C. Offices at 41-43 Goldington Road, Bedford, and at the Police Station, High Street, Sharnbrook. These may be inspected there free of charge between the hours of 9 a.m. and 1 p.m. and 2 p.m. and 5 p.m. Monday to Friday.

Copies of so much of the Modified Draft Map, Statement and Schedule of Modifications as relate to each Parish in the Bedford Rural District are available for inspection in those Parishes by arrangement with the Parish Clerk or the Chairman of the Parish Meeting wherever appropriate.

Any representations or objection with respect to this determination should be made in writing and addressed to the Clerk of the County Council, Shire Hall, Bedford, before the 30th day of December 1966 and should state the grounds upon which it is made.

## SURREY COUNTY COUNCIL

*Public Rights of Way*

Notice is hereby given that, pursuant to the provisions of section 33 of the National Parks and Access to the Countryside Act, 1949, the Surrey County Council have reviewed the particulars contained in the revised definitive rights of way map and statement for the present area of the Administrative County with the exception of the Urban Districts of Staines and Sunbury-on-Thames, having regard to events which occurred between the 1st January, 1959 (the last preceding date of review) and the 1st June 1966, which they have determined as the date of the current review.

Following completion of the review, the County Council have prepared a revised rights of way map and statement in draft form for the area referred to above, indicating the public rights of way which subsisted or are reasonably alleged to have subsisted on the 1st June 1966, the date of review.

The revised map and statement in draft form may be inspected between the hours of 9 a.m. and 5 p.m., Monday to Friday inclusive, at Room 119 at the County Hall, Penrhyn Road, Kingston upon Thames. Appropriate extracts from the map and statement have been supplied to each Borough, Urban and Rural District Council in the area covered by the map, and may be inspected by arrangement with those authorities. An extract relating to each rural Parish has also been supplied to the Clerk to the Parish Council or the Chairman of the Parish Meeting, as appropriate, and may be inspected by arrangement with the persons concerned.

Subject to the provisions of section 32(4) of the above-mentioned Act, representations or objections with respect to the revised map and statement in draft form may be made in writing to the undersigned not later than the 31st March 1967, and should state fully the nature of such representation or objection, describe the path concerned and state the registered number (if any) of such path.

## AYLESBURY RURAL DISTRICT COUNCIL

*Aylesbury Rural District Council (Footpath No. 11, Brill) Diversion Order, 1966*

Notice is hereby given that the above Order made on the 23rd November 1966 is about to be submitted to the Minister of Housing and Local Government for confirmation.

Its effect is to divert that part of Footpath No. 11 in the parish of Brill from the point where it leaves The Firs estate road, approximately 460 feet east of All Saints Church, Brill, in a northerly direction for approximately 410 feet and then easterly for approximately 430 feet, to Spa Farm access road, together with a short length of path extending from the aforementioned path from a point approximately 410 feet north of The Firs estate road in a north-westerly direction for approximately 60 feet to a wicket gate, to a line running from the aforementioned point approximately 460 feet east of All Saints Church and following The Firs estate road and Spa Farm access road in a generally north-easterly direction for approximately 780 feet and the northern most boundary of No. 23 The Firs in a north-westerly direction for approximately 150 feet and then northerly for approximately 100 feet to the wicket gate.
