1. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that Tenders will be received at the Chief Cashier's Office, at the Bank of England on Friday the 9th December 1966, at 1 p.m. for Treasury Bills to be issued under the Treasury Bills Act, 1877, the National Debt Act, 1889, and the National Loans Act, 1939, to the amount of £170,000,000.

2. The Bills will be in amounts of £5,000, £10,000, £25,000, £50,000 or £100,000. They will be dated at the option of the tenderer on any business day from Monday the 12th December to Saturday the 17th December 1966, inclusive, and will be due 91 days after date.

3. The Bills will be issued and paid at the Bank of England.

4. Each Tender must be for an amount not less than £50,000 and must specify the date on which the Bills required are to be dated, and the net amount per cent. (being an even multiple of one penny) which will be given for the amount applied for. Separate Tenders must be lodged for Bills of different dates.

5. Tenders must be made through a London Banker, Discount House or Broker.

6. Notification will be sent by post on the same day as Tenders are received, to the persons whose Tenders are accepted in whole or in part and payment in full of the amounts due in respect of such accepted Tenders must be made to the Bank of England by means of cash or by draft or cheque drawn on the Bank of England not later than 1.30 p.m. (Saturday 11 a.m.) on the day on which the relative Bills are to be dated.

7. Members of the House of Commons are not precluded from tendering for these Bills.

8. Tenders must be made on the printed forms which may be obtained from the Chief Cashier's Office, Bank of England.

9. The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury reserve the right of rejecting any Tenders.

The Lords Commissioners of Her Majesty's Treasury hereby give notice that they have made an Order under sections 1, 2 and 13 of the Import Duties Act, 1958, viz:

The Import Duties (General) (No. 9) Order, 1966.

This Order imposes a full rate of import duty of 20 per cent. ad valorem on certain chemical surface-active agents and preparations.

The Order comes into operation on 1st December 1966, and has been published as Statutory Instruments 1966, No. 1472.

TOWN AND COUNTRY PLANNING ACT 1962

The Secretary of State hereby gives notice that he proposes to make an Order under section 153 of the above Act to authorise the diversion of a footpath at Llanvaches near Newport in order to enable development, consisting of the extraction of dolomitic limestone from Penhow Quarry, Penhow to be carried out in accordance with planning permission granted to United Transport Company Quarry Holdings Ltd., by Monmouthshire County Council.

The diversion to be authorised will involve the provision of a new footpath maintainable at the public expense, for which the highway authority is to be the Monmouthshire County Council.
