#### HIGHWAYS ACT, 1959

##### *The London—Thurso Trunk Road (Gosforth High Street Diversion) Order 1966*

The Minister of Transport hereby gives notice that she proposes to make an Order under sections 7 and 44 of the above Act providing that a road which she proposes to construct at Gosforth in the county of Northumberland extending to its junction with the A.1 road in the county borough of Newcastle-upon-Tyne, and the existing A.1 road from this point southwards to its junction with Grandstand Road, shall become trunk roads as from the date when the Order comes into operation. It is also proposed that the length of the London-Thurso Trunk Road to be superseded shall cease to be a trunk road as from the date on which notice is given by the Minister to the Urban District Council of Gosforth (who will become the highway authority responsible for that length) that the new trunk road is open for through traffic.

##### *The Durham (Black Fell—White Mare Pool) Special Roads (Transport) Order 1966*

of the 7th February 1967, apply to the High Court for the suspension or quashing of the Order or of any provision contained therein.

## MINISTRY OF PUBLIC BUILDING AND WORKS

### ANCIENT MONUMENTS ACTS 1913 TO 1953

The Minister of Public Building and Works hereby gives notice that, in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 11 of the Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments Act 1953, he proposes to make a Preservation Order affecting the camp site at Sutton Walls in the Parish of Sutton in the county of Hereford of which the following is a draft:—

The Minister of Public Building and Works in exercise of the powers conferred on him by section 11 of the Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments Act 1953 and of all other powers enabling him in this behalf hereby makes the following Order:

1. In this Order the following expressions shall have the following meanings:—

- (a) "the Act" means the Historic Buildings and Ancient Monuments Act 1953.
- (b) "the Minister" means the Minister of Public Building and Works.
- (c) "the monument" means the ancient monument consisting of the camp site at Sutton Walls in the Parish of Sutton in the county of Hereford which is shown on the plan annexed to this Order and thereon coloured pink.

2. The monument (in respect of which an Interim Preservation Notice under section 10 of the Act is in force) is hereby placed under the more lasting protection of the Minister.

3. (1) (a) Any person having an interest in the whole or any part of the monument shall be entitled to receive compensation equal to the amount by which the value of that interest is diminished by the service of the Interim Preservation Notice and by the coming into operation of this Order.

(b) Such a person shall also be entitled to receive compensation equal to

(i) the amount of any damage which he suffers in respect of his said interest in consequence of the refusal or the granting, subject to conditions, of consent to the demolition or removal of the monument or to the making of additions or alterations thereto or to the carrying out of work in connection therewith, and
