(ii) the amount of any expenditure incurred by him in respect of his said interest in consequence of such refusal or such granting of consent subject to conditions.
(2) Any question as to whether a person has such an interest as aforesaid or as to the nature or extent of that interest or see to the right of

or extent of that interest or as to the right of any such person to compensation or the amount of any such compensation shall be determined by the Lands Tribunal on the application either of the Minister or of the person claiming such compensation.

(3) In the determination of any question as to compensation payable pursuant to this Order it shall be assumed that this Order will not at

any time be revoked.

) Compensation payable in accordance with paragraph (a) of sub-clause (1) of this clause shall consist of a single payment to be finally assessed on the coming into operation of this (4) Compensation Order.

(5) Compensation shall not be payable under sub-clause (1) of this clause for which a claim in writing has not been made to the Minister before writing has not been made to the Minister before the expiry of three months after the coming into operation of this Order in the case of claims under paragraph (a) of sub-clause (1) or three months after the damage or expenditure has been suffered or incurred in the case of claims under paragraph (b) of sub-clause (1) or in either case such longer period as the Minister may allow showing the amounts claimed under the said paragraphs (a) and (b) respectively with such particulars as are necessary to explain how the several amounts are made up. the several amounts are made up.
