

## EASTLEIGH BOROUGH COUNCIL

*The Borough of Eastleigh (Chalvington Road)  
(Prohibition of Waiting) Order, 1967*

Notice is hereby given that on the 20th day of February 1967, the Eastleigh Borough Council made an Order under sections 26 and 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which is to prohibit the waiting of vehicles at any time in both sides of that length of Chalvington Road from the junction with Bournemouth Road for a distance of 102 feet in an easterly direction.

Exceptions are provided in the Order to allow a vehicle to wait for so long as may be necessary to enable persons to board or alight and goods to be loaded or unloaded and to enable vehicles to be used in connection with building operations and public works.

Desborough Road) (Prohibition of Waiting) Order,  
1967.*

Notice is hereby given that on the 20th day of February 1967 the Eastleigh Borough Council made an Order under sections 26 and 27 of the Road Traffic Act, 1960, the effect of which will be to prohibit vehicles waiting

1. At any time in the length of road contained in the First Schedule hereto;
2. Between the hours of 9 a.m. and 6 p.m. on Mondays to Saturdays inclusive in the length of road specified in the Second Schedule hereto;

Exceptions will be provided in the Order to allow vehicles to wait as long as may be necessary to enable persons to board or alight and goods to be loaded or unloaded and to enable vehicles to be used in connection with building operations and public works.

The Order will come into operation on the 20th day of February 1967.

North Side—from a point opposite the boundary between the Roman Catholic Church and 53 Leigh Road for a distance of 66 yards in a westerly direction.

## EPSOM AND EWELL BOROUGH COUNCIL

*The Borough of Epsom and Ewell (Street Parking  
Places) (Stoneleigh) Order 1967  
and**The Borough of Epsom and Ewell (Prohibition  
of Waiting) (Stoneleigh) Order 1967*

A Public Inquiry will be held by Mr. G. S. McIntire, C.B.E., M.A., LL.B., at the Town Hall, The Parade, Epsom, Surrey, on Monday, 3rd April 1967, at 10.30 a.m. to consider the proposals of the Epsom and Ewell Borough Council to make Orders under the provisions of the Road Traffic Act 1960 (as amended) and the Road Traffic and Roads Improvement Act, 1960, as follows:

1. *The Borough of Epsom and Ewell (Street  
Parking Places) (Stoneleigh) Order 1967*

The effect of this Order will be

To designate The Broadway (including the service roads) and Station Approach, Stoneleigh, as street parking places and to regulate the use thereof. The Order shall operate between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. on Mondays to Fridays inclusive and during this period, vehicles will be permitted to wait in a parking place free of charge for a maximum period of two hours; provision is made for the removal and disposal of vehicles abandoned on parking places.

2. *The Borough of Epsom and Ewell (Prohibition  
of Waiting) (Stoneleigh) Order 1967*

The effect of this Order will be

To prohibit vehicles from waiting between the hours of 8.30 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. and the loading and unloading of vehicles between the hours of 11 a.m. and 6.30 p.m. for more than twenty minutes outside the same premises on Mondays to Fridays inclusive in the lengths of roads specified in the Schedule hereto. The usual exemptions to permit the waiting of vehicles for certain specified purposes will apply.

A copy of a statement of reasons for making the Orders may be obtained on application to the office of the undersigned and a draft of the proposed Orders and a map may be seen there during normal office hours.

Any person interested is entitled to be heard in person or by Counsel, Solicitor or Agent and any person whether he intends to appear at the Inquiry or not may forward any objection to the proposals to Mr. G. S. McIntire at the undermentioned address by not later than 20th March 1967.
