That in some short time after We did intend to give Diediens for the Calling of a new Parliament, We do by to Our Royal Proclamation Publish and Declare, That. ab the Advice of Our Privy Council, We have this Day for Order to Our Chancellor of Great Britain to Issue out Wits in due Form for the Summoning and Holding a New Indiament, which Writs are to bear Teste the I wenty fixth By of this Instant April, and to be Returnable on Thursby the Eighth of July next ensuing the Date hereof.

And we humbly beg Leave, on this Occasion, unani-moully to renew our former Assurances of adhering to jour Majesty, with our Lives and Fortunes, in the Defence of your Royal Person and Government, both in Church and State, and of the Protestant Succession as settled by law, against the said Pretender, and all Opposers of the ame whatforver. Dated at Nottingham, wader our Comof your Majesty's glorious Reign.

To the QUEEN's most Excellent Majesty.

The humble Address of the High-Sheriff, Lord-Lieutenant and Custos Rotulorum, Noblemen, Deputy-Lieutenants, Julices of the Peace, Grand-Jury, Clergy, Gentlemen and Freeholders, within the County of Leicester, at the Affizes held at the Castle of Leicester, the 19th Day of March, in the feventh Year of your Majesty's Reign; presented to Her Majesty by the Right Honourable the Marquis of Granby.

E your Majesty's most loyal and dutiful Subjects. being very fenfible that the Safety of your most facred Person, and Preservation of your Government, are our Interest as well as our Duty, cannot but with the greatest Detestation abhor the intended Invasion, by an Enemy, whose whole Design was the Ruin of our Religion, and the Enslaving of Europe, and to set a Popsish Pretender on the Throne, to the Destruction of all our facred and civil Interests, and to descat the Establishment in the Protestant Line.

We humbly beg Leave to affure your Majesty, that we will to the utmost maintain and defend your Majesty's Person and Goverment, against all Attempts and Pretenders whatfoever.

May the Divine Providence protect your Royal Perfon, direct your Councils, prosper your Arms by Sea and Land, and bring these Wars to a sappy Conclusion; and may your Majesty be bless'd with a long Life, and be the happy Restorer of Peace and Liberty to Europe.
