EXCHANGE CONTROL ACT, 1947

The Treasury, in exercise of the powers conferred upon them by sections 37 (2) (b) and 41 (1) of the Exchange Control Act, 1947, hereby direct that the Treasury Direction given on 25th March 1942, under paragraph 3A of Regulation 3c of the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1939 be revoked with effect from 19th May 1967.

Explanatory Note

This revokes a Direction made by the Treasury on 25th March 1942, which in current circumstances is

25th March 1942, which in current circumstances is of insignificant practical effect.

The Direction was first made under the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1939, and published in the London Gazette. By virtue of Article 3 of the Exchange Control (Transitional Provisions) Order, 1947 (S. R. and O. 1947/2052) this Direction was continued in force as if it had been given under section 41 (1) of the Exchange Control Act, 1947.

The effect of the Direction was that, where all the personal representatives of a deceased person were resident in the sterling area, they should be treated as there resident for the purpose of receiving and making payments, notwithstanding that the deceased was resident outside the sterling area. This dispensation was necessary under the Defence (Finance) Regulations, 1939, as personal representatives would otherwise have required specific consents for nearly otherwise have required specific consents for nearly every phase of the administration of a non-resident estate. The Direction is today unnecessary because many personal representatives find it more convenient to deal with non-resident estates on a non-resident basis throughout.
